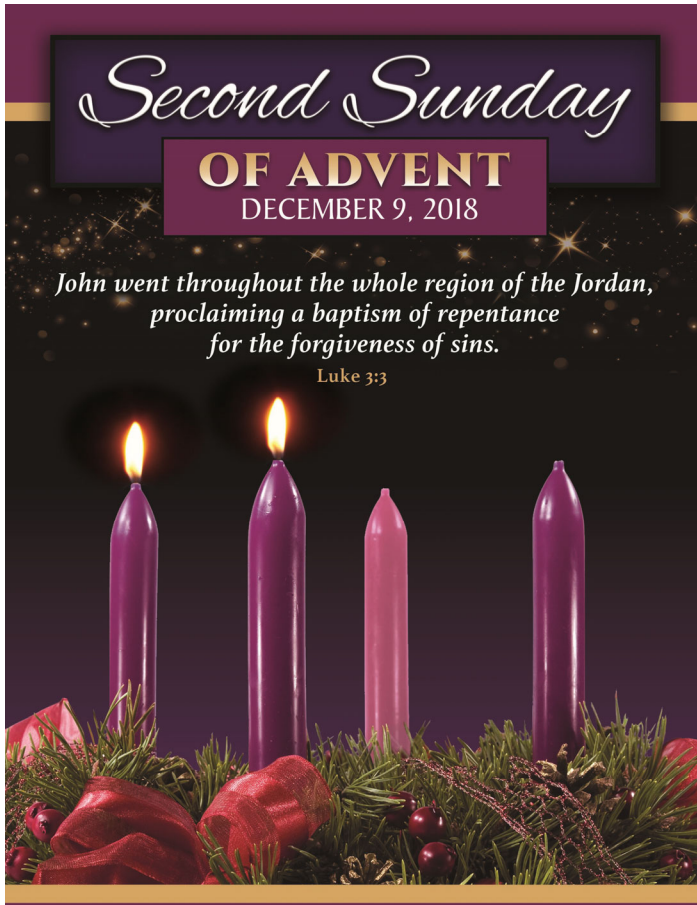

About the O Antiphons:

The "O Antiphons" are a series of seven Advent Prayers developed by Benedictine Monks in the Middle Ages. They are based on Isaiah's prophecies about Jesus and each one begins by beseeching "O" and then addresses Christ using a particular title (Wisdom, Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Dayspring, King, Emmanuel). We often pray these prayers ourselves when we sing the ancient hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

The order of each prayer is significant. Starting with the last title in reverse order, the first letter of each (Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia) forms an acrostic: the Latin words *Ero cras*, which speak Jesus' response and promise to us: "Tomorrow, I will come."
