From the Desk of Deacon Jerry Readings for Sunday, August 16 ~ 20th Sunday Ordinary Time Isa 56:1. 6-7 Rom 11:13-15, 29-32 Matt 15:21-28: L118A Latin Mass – 11th Sunday after Pentecost

1Cor 15:1-10 and Mk 7:31-37

Cancellations ... Due to restrictions in place and safety concerns over the spread of the coronavirus, our Polka Mass and Christmas Party are cancelled this year. We look forward to having these events return in 2021.

Persistence in Our Prayer ... In our Gospel this Sunday we find Jesus speaking to the Canaanite woman in a way that makes many of us feel uneasy. The woman pleads for Jesus to heal her daughter, but he refuses because she is not an Israelite. Jesus explains that his ministry is only for the lost sheep of the house of Israel, and not for a Canaanite woman and her family. Just imagine how difficult it must have been for her to stand up as an outcast and as a woman to this group of men who obviously do not want her there. She must have known that it would be risky to show up, speak out, and make her request, much less talk back and persist if denied! This Gospel is a testament to persistence and the power of prayer. The woman faced several obstacles during her prayer for her daughter. The disciples wanted to send her away for bothering them and Jesus even denied her request at first. Despite this, the woman persisted. She continued after Jesus' harsh comment comparing her people to dogs. She had a relentless faith. And it was her relentless faith and persistence that finally prompted Jesus to heal her daughter. Haven't we all prayed about something, only to be left puzzled by the Lord's response? Many times we may have even felt put off by God, or questioned if he heard our prayers at all. It can be frustrating and disheartening, and can even try our faith. Our readings tell us that sometimes we simply need to be persistent and patient. Besides persistence in our prayer the Canaanite woman also teaches us "filial boldness." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (2610) explains this as believing that we will receive what we ask for in prayer. This boldness helps us persist when we think no one hears our prayers, or something gets in the way of them being answered. When it seems that God is silent in the face of our prayers – or that his answer is no – let us pray to the Holy Spirit for the fortitude to persist like the Canaanite woman in unwavering confidence and faith.
