

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON JERRY

Jesus Prays for Us! ... It is hard to believe we are already at the Seventh and last Sunday of Easter. Given what has happened over the past two and a half months I have heard a few comments that this was "the Easter that wasn't." But I would say for most of us it is the opposite, Easter has been very real and present in our lives as we all have found creative and new ways to pray and to engage ourselves in our faith and the mystery of the Resurrection. In this week's Gospel from John we have a striking example of prayer as we are given this beautiful and intriguing final prayer of Jesus. He has just finished a meal with his apostles on the night he will be betrayed and handed over for crucifixion and now he concludes by saying farewell and praying for them. Jesus knew the Apostles would need his prayers in the coming days as the cost of being one of his followers would be high and at times their lives would be in danger and there would be times when they would be tempted to run. He didn't pray that they be released from their problems rather they would have the strength to face and overcome them. Jesus' prayer was not only for the disciples in his day and time – it was for us today. Jesus knows that we are still in the world and he knows the circumstances we face today. His prayer for us is that we have strength to face what we encounter. As we reflect on our Gospel on this Seventh Sunday of Easter, how does this passage speak to us? As Christ's disciples in the world today, we can take comfort in our relationship with Christ especially knowing that Jesus prays for us! Just as he speaks of the original disciples with great affection and care, he has the same love and care for us. He gives us a model for our own prayer and it is that when we are faced with fear, an important decision or tough times in life we should not just try to go about it alone and leave it to chance – we need to raise our eyes to heaven and turn to Jesus in prayer.

Memorial Day ... This year, May 25 is Memorial Day, a day when we remember those who have died in service to this country. We are reminded that we do have a Christian responsibility to pray for the dead as a spiritual work of mercy. We also want to remember that each of us are called to work toward the peace of God's kingdom. Please take time to pray for those who have died in service to our country and also remember to pray for peace and an end to war.
