Pray for Vocations... You are encouraged to take a moment to look at the posters on the bulletin boards at the entrance of the church as they show the current group of seminarians in our diocese studying for the priesthood. Please remember them in your prayers and especially please continue to pray for more vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life, especially here in our diocese. October is the month of the rosary and a perfect time for each of us to pray the rosary for vocations.

Persistence in Prayer!...What does it mean to be persistent? Many sources define it as the "firm or obstinate continuance in a course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition." Some synonyms for this "obstinate continuance" include: perseverance, tenacity, and endurance. Our Sunday readings offer us a couple of good examples of persistence.

In our first reading from Exodus we find the Israelites facing another hardship on their way to the Promised Land – war has been waged against them. After giving Joshua his marching orders Moses climbs to the top of the hill with the staff of God and raises his hands. Moses uses the staff which is a symbol of God's saving power and to remind the people that God will bring them safely to the Promised Land if they place their trust in him. In lifting the staff and allowing others to help him keep it lifted, Moses recognized the Israelites' need to be assured that God was indeed with them and would lead them to victory. Through his persistence Moses helped give them the courage they needed to go forward into battle. In the Gospel Jesus uses the parable of the persistent widow to teach us persistence. Widows in the ancient world were incredibly vulnerable. The fact that this widow was alone when she approached and addressed the judge highlights just how extremely vulnerable she was. Yet she was strong enough to not only petition the judge, but also to persist in her pleas for justice. She even put sufficient pressure on him to influence his actions. Even though the judge was an unsavory character, he granted her request in order to avoid being hurt by the widow in some way. This poor vulnerable widow put herself out there to correct a wrong. What about us? Are we OK with putting ourselves out there? Maybe we start off with good intentions but what do we do when we feel like we have been praying persistently for our needs but God doesn't hear us? Do we do the easy thing and just give up? Do we doubt God? Do we think that just because he doesn't answer in the way we expect him to, he isn't listening to us at all? Think about it – our prayers have the capacity to profoundly change lives – the lives of those we are praying for and our own life. Our prayers are more than wishful thinking! Unlike the unjust judge who granted the widow's request for self-serving motives, God the Father hears and answers our prayers in the way and time which is best for us. In a culture that begs for instant gratification - we just need to take a cue from Moses and the widow by being patient and persistent.

This week's spiritual exercise: Reflect on areas of your life where you have become weary and perhaps even on the edge. Talk to Jesus about it and in silence ask for peace and strength as well as the courage to go forward.
