Our Knights Council has joined together with 23 other Knights Councils in Erie and Crawford Counties to conduct our annual **Baby Bottle Fundraiser**. It will **benefit the Women's Care Center** of Erie's goal of purchasing a new, state of the art **Ultrasound Machine** to replace an older unit at one of their other locations. Your donations will also be used to offset the operating costs of the Ultrasound Van that was purchased from the 2022 fundraiser. Last year through your contributions, \$119,000 was collected toward the cost of the Ultrasound Van. The Knights of Columbus Supreme based in Connecticut donated an additional \$59.000 to cover the entire cost of the Ultrasound Machine for the Van. Jesus is the way!

From ancient times philosophers have summed up the human condition as a quest to answer three fundamental questions: What should I do? What can I know? What can I hope for?

In our Gospel this week Jesus answers these questions, not merely with doctrine, but with his very person by telling us that he is the way, the truth, and the life.

"I am the way" can translate into: What should we do? Jesus tells us: Follow me! Do what I have done.

"I am the truth" means: what can we know? The truth is eventually we can know everything, but it requires more than just shifting the intellectual sands of this world. When we have faith, we come to know Jesus who is the truth, the secret behind the workings of the whole universe and the yearnings of the human heart.

"I am the life" means: what can we hope for? In Jesus, we can hope for and expect the fullness of life that we long for. Jesus is the bread of life, the light of the world, a ray of hope in our darkness. When we long to satisfy our heart's deepest needs it is our faith that leads us to seek the face of Jesus and leads us to the place, he has prepared for us. To seek anything else will lead to a dead end.

In our gospel the apostles were tense and troubled, and Thomas asks Jesus "How can we know the way?" We often ask the same question perhaps in a different way – often we will ask "How can we get to God?" Jesus reassured the apostles by inviting them to believe in him, to trust him and he does the same for us, as he promises us a place in his Father's house.

So, "How do we get to God" is really the wrong question because God finds us – he searches us through his son Jesus Christ. Are we willing to let him change our lives?

We have been given the answers to the deepest questions of life because we have come to know Jesus and he is not the endpoint of our search. Rather, he is the beginning of our adventure – his is our way, our truth, our very life.
