The Spirit of God in us

Each year on the second Sunday of Lent we hear the account of the transfiguration of Jesus lifting the veil of the mystery of heaven and giving us a glimpse of how the whole human race will be transformed and all creation will become bright and luminous with the presence of God. We get a preview of what human beings look like with God's spirit running through them.

When Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up the mountain and reveals his glory and lordship, he is also preparing them. It is soon that we will find Jesus with the same three in the Garden of Gethsemane, suffering his passion and preparing for the cross.

The transfiguration sets the stage for the Passion of Christ to unfold right before the disciples, to prepare them and strengthen their resolve to endure what was coming.

Lent is our time of preparation, a season to strengthen our resolve and to transform our spiritual lives. Each year during Lent we make an effort to challenge and disrupt our comfortable patterns of behavior by detaching ourselves from things we don't need or by taking specific actions, such as attending Mass more often, increasing our prayer time, performing acts of charity, or other actions that allow the spirit of God to run through us.

So what do we look like with the spirit of God running through us? Perhaps the most simplest answer this side of heaven is that we become more like Christ. We follow his commands and teachings and behave as he would. Our transfiguration or transformation occurs in our daily lives.

And we do not go at it alone. Jesus commands his disciples to "rise and do not be afraid" and he has the same command for us. To help us in the dark times Jesus gives us transfiguration moments of light and grace, mountaintop experiences of sort that help get us through times of turbulence. It may be through prayer or Scripture or the sacraments or perhaps through guidance we receive in spiritual direction, that give us a transfiguration moment and help us share in the mercy and glory of God.

Our gospel today reminds us that our ultimate end is to be transfigured and to be with Jesus in the heavenly realm sharing in his glory. Let's revisit Peter words in today's Gospel: "it is good that we are here." Can we say that about ourselves? How do we look with the Spirit of God running through our lives?
