FROM THE DESK OF DEACON JERRY

Extraordinary Lessons in Ordinary Time! ... Here we are, into the 13th Sunday in ordinary time. Have you ever thought about Ordinary time - what it is and why we have it in the Church calendar? Because of the connotations of the term "ordinary" in English, it is not uncommon for many to assume that Ordinary Time refers to the parts of the Church year that are unimportant. But nothing could be further from the truth. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" because the weeks are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, Ordinary Time is in fact the ordered life of the Church—the period where we have no big feasts or celebrations. It is a time for spiritual growth and a time for us to really deepen our commitment to living as Jesus taught us. Our readings selected for Ordinary Time are intended to provide us lessons on what it means to be a Christian and follow Jesus in our daily lives. This week in our Gospel from Matthew, Jesus gives us a candid teaching on the importance and demands of discipleship and what it means to follow him. As he sends the Apostles out to preach, he reminds them that they can expect hardship and a variety of responses to their preaching. Yet they are not to be afraid of whatever might happen, for they will never be without his care and love. Making the choice to follow Jesus, and then living it fully, is difficult and challenging – even Jesus acknowledges this. To follow him means that we must deny our deep-seated tendencies toward self-sufficiency and self-indulgence in favor of obedience and self-governance. Yet Jesus never asks us to give more than he has already given. When we put God first, when we serve God before all else, we are rewarded with the promise of eternal life. In the days and weeks ahead, especially in the midst of the challenges we face in our world, community and our lives, may we let that promise inspire and strengthen our commitment to be faithful disciples and to bring others to Christ. Let us use the extraordinary lessons of Ordinary time for spiritual growth and a deepening our commitment to live as Jesus taught us knowing full well that we too will never be without his care and love.

We look forward to having the Novena next year and hope to make it special considering what has happened this year. Reopening our Parish for Public Masses.

Given concerns for the safety and health of everyone, as well as our current inability to comply with the required protocols, we have delayed re-opening our churches for public masses. In the next several weeks we will meet with Pastoral Council and re-assess our ability to comply with the restrictions and protocol and re-evaluate our status on June 30. Our priests and the majority of our parishioners are in the high- risk category defined by the CDC. As the behavior and spread of the virus continues to remain unpredictable, it is still too risky to gather – even with social distancing practices in place. The protocol for re-establishing public masses as outlined by the Bishop is very demanding and complex. To meet this protocol will require a core group of volunteers willing to be at all masses. The decision to re-open is also optional and the dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day masses still remains in effect. Several parishes in our diocese as well as other areas of the country have chosen to delay re-opening for public masses.
