# **Look into the Eyes of Jesus**

Our readings this week and especially our Gospel have us confronting the grim and inevitable aspect of being human. That is, we are fragile, and eventually we all die. Yet the account of Jesus' healing powers offers us a glimpse of hope as we witness his encounter with the two women.

What is distinctive about these encounters, beside the healing is rather than taking a quick, impersonal approach Jesus took the time to speak to each person, to look into their eyes, and to touch them, and not simply relieve them of their affliction. Once again, we see right into the merciful heart of Jesus.

Just as he did with the women in the Gospel when we come face to face with Jesus, he recognizes our pain, faith and courage. He looks into our eyes, touches us and desires to heal us. He desires this so much that he suffered and died so that we might live. Even though suffering and death are inevitable the miracles in today's Gospel remind us that by Jesus' own suffering, death, and resurrection, death does not have the final word. Death does not have the final sting. The good news is that Jesus has conquered all things, even death itself and he gives each one of us the same opportunity. He has prepared a place for us in his Father's kingdom that is free from suffering, pain, and heartache.

Let us approach Jesus confident of his care and his desire for us to share in his promise of eternal life. May we allow him to look directly in our eyes and work for our sake, and that of the world.
