



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Happy 6th Sunday of Easter! Please join us in the Act of Contrition: *O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended thee. I detest all of my sins because of thy just punishments but most of all because I have offended you my God who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of thy grace to sin no more and avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.* † And now we invite you to make a spiritual communion: *My Jesus, I firmly believe that you are really and truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above things and I hope and long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come now spiritually into my heart and soul. I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you and your Sacred Heart. Never permit me to be separated from you. I pray through Christ our Risen, Triumphant, and Victorious Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, Amen.* † We miss seeing all of you at the weekend Masses and we can't wait for the day when all of you will be able to join us again for the weekend and weekday Masses. Until then be sure to say your daily prayers especially the rosary and the act of contrition. † Bishop Persico has recently sent us the following protocols: 1) the suspension of all public Masses remains in effect. 2. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation remains in effect throughout the diocese. 3. A dispensation from the Easter duty is granted throughout the diocese. 4. Live streaming of Sunday and Weekday Masses should continue wherever feasible. (EWTN broadcasts the Mass three times each day!). 5. Spiritual Communion should continue to be encouraged. These are difficult days for all of us. For you and your families and all of our parishioners, Our Mother of Sorrow's Parish remains committed to the spiritual care of all parishioners and the entire community at large. Although how we do that has changed temporarily, our purpose remains the same. Please be assured of our daily prayers for all of you and our private Masses for your special intentions. † Unfortunately our parish offices must be closed to the public during this time, we will reopen as soon as the emergency situation has ended and we are given permission by both the government and the diocese. Thank you for your understanding, patience, and charity. Stay Calm, Stay Home, Stay Safe! † Pope Francis has asked that we pray the rosary during May to end the virus. Bishop Persico has dedicated our diocese to Mary, Mother of the Church. Pray for an end to the virus! Pray for the health and safety of all! Holy Mary, pray for us! Sincerely in our Risen Triumphant, and Victorious Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Thank you and God bless and keep all of you!

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON JERRY

We Need to Love One Another! In our Gospel this week Jesus tells us plainly, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." So what does it mean to keep Jesus' commandments? It means much more than reducing our faith to a set of rules to follow and a checklist of actions to accomplish. It means that we follow Jesus' way of life – a life characterized by deep care for others. A life of love!

This call to love Jesus by following his commandments by loving and caring for our neighbors is challenging. To truly love another human being requires much from us. Keeping the commandments means much more than pray, pay, and obey – it means that each of us love and care for our neighbors.

One way we can keep Jesus' commandments is by living in hope. Even in our current times, when things seem so uncertain and difficult, we can dare to hope. Hope, prayer, and love for one another is what has enabled people over the centuries to endure difficulties and trials in the darkest moments.

The witness of hope in the midst of life's challenges can be a powerful message. If we want to see the love of Christ in action, what it means to keep his commandments, all we need to do is turn to the examples of love and kindness that people are extending to each other in the midst of our current situation.

Our Gospel challenges each of us to move beyond fear, skepticism, disillusionment, and perhaps hopelessness – thinking there is nothing we can do. We are not alone - Jesus did not abandon us to carry out this ministry of love without support. He sent his Spirit to abide with us.

Our world is starving for the love of Christ and much of it doesn't even know it. It is longing to hear the words Jesus shared with his apostles. It is yearning for hope and where will it come from? Each of us must do more than just "follow the rules." We must bring the hope and love of Christ to others in any way we can, no matter how large or small.

As Saint Teresa of Ávila wrote, "Christ has no body on earth without us." So, if we do not speak and act for Christ, who will?

Next Steps toward Reopening...There has been much discussion in the past two weeks on the gradual restoration of public worship in our churches and especially how to make the Eucharist available to everyone. Bishop Persico will host a virtual town hall meeting on May 21 at 7 p.m. You will be invited to sign up for the event through Zoom and will be able to submit questions by email for the Bishop. The event will later be posted on Diocese's web site. I will also try to summarize the meeting and comments in a future bulletin for those who were not able to attend and do not have access to the technology to review the summary.
