Attached is our parish's **formal response to the preliminary pastoral plan** which I hand delivered to the Pastoral Planning Committee on Thursday. This response was developed in a meeting after the 11:00 am Mass last week. While acknowledging the need for change our councils have requested a modification to the plan they feel will meet the best interests of everyone while including feedback from the parish community received at our parish Town Hall Meeting on September 17, 2023.

Please remember to provide your individual feedback to the preliminary plan, even if you attended the Town Hall Meeting, to the diocese at <u>www.eriercd.org/planning.html</u>. **The deadline for feedback has been extended to October 9**. If you prefer to do it by hard copy there are forms in the back of the church. Otherwise call the parish office and we will get one out to you. The address to send your feedback to is at the end of the form. **Please do not send the forms to the parish office.**

The purchase of the **Holy Family** property is proceeding. Since the church is not being sold the property will be need to be subdivided prior to closing. The buyer is making the arrangements to have that done and it is expected to take a couple of weeks or more.

What you do speaks more than what you say!

How many times have we found it easier to tell someone what he or she wanted to hear with no intention of following through, in order to avoid a difficult conversation?

In our Gospel parable the two sons are ordered by their father to "go out and work in the vineyard" and this is not an unreasonable request. The first son originally disobeyed the father, but then had a change of mind and did what the father asked of him. He did his father's will – not the second son who said yes, which is what his father wanted to hear, yet did nothing.

This parable reminds us of the truth that living as a faithful disciple of Jesus and doing God's will is not about words, it is about action. If we are to be truthful - and true to the Lord - it is not what we say, it is what we do, and how we do it. We are all familiar with the famous words of St. Francis: Go out and preach the Gospel and use words if necessary!

As disciples of Christ, we are called to love God and others, not simply through what we say but, but more importantly what we do, the ways we give of ourselves for the good of all. Once again let us pray over this Gospel and examine our lives this week. Where is God calling us to more action and fewer words?
