What do you want me to do for You? ... In our Gospel this week Jesus asks Bartimaeus a very curious question: "What do you want me to do for you?" So why does he ask this question when he already knew what Bartimaeus needed? He respected his freedom and brought forth an explicit act of faith. The blind man was persistently calling out to Jesus while the crowd was trying to silence him and make him go away. But Bartimaeus wouldn't go away because he saw something no one else in the crowd that day saw. He saw Jesus through his inner sight – the supernatural eyes of faith and he came to know Jesus better that those who saw him by the natural light of day. What would we say if Jesus walked up to each of us right here, right now and asked "What do you want me to do for you?" How is our faith – our inner sight? Bartimaeus gives us a three-part lesson on faith: A call to faith, a show of Faith, and the Result of Faith A call to faith: Take courage, get up, Jesus is calling you. Poor Bartimaeus could have easily given up all hope. But what did he do – he shed his cloak, his only protection from the elements, and went to Jesus. Jesus is asking us to shed our cloaks, to root out of our lives whatever it is that keeps us from seeing who he is. It may be in the form of selfcenteredness, preoccupation with getting ahead amassing more money and material goods or seeking comfort above all else. In a show of faith, Bartimaeus comes to Jesus. That is significant because although blind he walks on his own. All of us have our limitations and shortcomings. Jesus is telling us to overcome them and he will meet us wherever we are on life's journey and bring us clearer vision. Most often our new "sight" will come from other people; someone points out a shortcoming; we are challenged to another viewpoint; we are helped to see the good in what seems like a hopeless situation. The result of faith. Each of us longs to hear the question Jesus puts to Bartimaeus: "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus does not ask for anything for himself. Immediately upon receiving his sight he uses his new gift of vision to follow Jesus. So goes it with us – this precious gift of faith affects our sight – the ability to see God at work in our daily lives; that gift of sight deepens our longing to live by faith and to follow Jesus in our life's journey. The result of faith? We are not only called to follow Jesus we are called to put this faith in action. When we want something badly enough, we tend to not give up – in spite of opposition by the crowd Bartimaeus continued to call out to Jesus and receive what he wanted – and more. The brief exchange between Jesus and Bartimaeus drew their hearts together and Jesus responds to his deep faith: "Go your way, your faith has saved you." Do we have the courage to do the same – to leave our cloaks behind? To let Jesus into our lives in spite of what others say and think? To seek his help in prayer – to call him by name. If so, our lives will be dramatically changed. We will find ourselves no longer sitting by the side of the road waiting to be helped, but walking on the road with Jesus, bringing our gift of faith-vision to those in need.
