Filling our lamps

As we approach the First Sunday of Advent and come to the close of this Church year our readings take on a more urgent and somber tone and we are reminded of the end times. The parable of the wise and foolish maidens provides us a lesson about the importance of preparing to meet the Lord by making wise choices each and every day.

In our Gospel today Jesus cautions us to "stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." He is warning us to prepare to meet him and not to be like the foolish bridesmaids that thought they could get more oil for their lamps whenever they wanted and that the door of the house would always be opened to them. The oil symbolizes the source of light and the fact the wise virgins already had this oil showed their desire to possess the ultimate source of light in their lives, Jesus Christ. They were prepared.

How best can we prepare to meet Jesus? Perhaps it is to follow his basic teachings: about forgiving others, be generous to those in need, be grateful for what we have, doing what we say we are going to do, and not expecting reward for doing the right thing. To prepare means to love God with all our mind, heart and soul, and humbly love our neighbor as ourselves. To stay active in our faith and participate in the sacramental life of the church. To lead a good life with plenty of oil in our lamps.

Our oil is the energy of the Holy Spirit in our lives and represents our capacity to love. As we prepare and wait for his return, may we always imitate Jesus' care and compassion for others, especially the most vulnerable among us. Then will we will be prepared with enough oil to keep our lamps lit, ready to greet the Lord when he arrives.
