22:32 Men’s Conference offers in-person and Zoom format

The eighth annual 22:32 Men’s Conference, typically offered to hundreds of men at one location, will be held Feb. 27 at separate parishes in the Diocese of Erie. Men will gather at their own parishes in small groups to minimize the spread of COVID-19. The half-day event still features acclaimed Catholic speakers and witness stories that may be heard via Zoom beginning at 9 a.m. and ending at noon. Our Source of Authority!

For the most part we are accustomed to knowing authority as defined according to its source. A king, for instance has “inherited authority” by virtue of having been born into a royal line. The president of a corporation exercises “delegated authority” which comes from the board of directors. A professor in a university has “achieved authority” based on years of academic preparation, research and experience. In each case the source of authority is outside the person who holds the power to rule a kingdom, run a business, or teach a class. In our Gospel this week, the people responded to Jesus as one with authority after he taught them and then cast out the “unclean spirit.” Jesus’ authority that we hear about in our Gospel is radically different than the authority that was just described. Jesus **IS** the source of authority and he refers to no source of authority beyond himself. At one time in our lives most of us have either questioned authority or perhaps even rejected it. And we too are challenged by our own demons and temptations from the evil one. The Good News of the Gospel does not exclude a confrontation with the devil, in fact it is the very test of authority which we all struggle with. However, when we invoke the authority of Jesus Christ in our lives there is often a violent, convulsive confrontation with the evil one who wants so much to possess our souls and rule our lives, and he comes out of us. This Gospel is more than about Jesus’ teaching and deeds. It is about us being taken in by who Jesus is - the one who teaches with authority, who destroys evil, and who is “the Holy One of God” among us and within us. The Holy One who acts with compassion and whose authority liberates. Our challenge is not only to know him but to fall in love with him.
