There was a lot of discussion on how our parishes can continue to collaborate on Faith Formation and Outreach as well as working together on liturgical events such as Stations, Adoration, etc. We are planning to get our parish representatives involved in the planning process soon. Briefly discussed was how to restart the talks on our facilities as well as the future of our parishes. I told the group that there is a considerable amount of anxiety among many people I have spoken to over the uncertainty of the future. As new plans develop, I will share them with you. Choose the Better Half! ... Luke's gospel gives us several examples of the active role that women played in salvation history. Today hospitality is one of the focuses in this short passage. Jesus is visiting the home of Martha and Mary, the sisters of Lazarus and they have very different ideas about how Jesus should be welcomed into their home. For Martha, he is an important guest, and she feels it is necessary to prepare a feast. Mary senses that Jesus will not be with them much longer and she doesn't want to leave his feet for even a moment. Martha is stunned that Jesus sides with Mary and she feels that Mary should be serving the guest, not wasting time at his feet. Yet, Jesus favors Mary as having chosen the better part, if only by making time to be in his presence instead of being distracted by the business of what else needs to be done. What a challenging lesson in discipleship these women give us! We too can become so busy, distracted and overwhelmed with the affairs of daily life that we sometimes find it hard to make time for God. While discipleship often requires meeting physical needs as we see in Martha, Jesus reminds us that discipleship is also about truly being present with and for others. All of us have been with another person who was so preoccupied and distracted that they barely acknowledged our presence, let alone heard what we said. It is only when we are attentive to those we encounter that we can fully respond. It is only when we are attentive to Jesus and choose him over all of our other distractions that we can hear his voice and follow his invitation and command. Following the lesson from the women in our gospel may we continually seek to find a balance between prayer and work, doing all things for God's glory and for the good of others. May we always choose the better half!
