We are all called to Sainthood! ... The Feast of All Saints offers a glimpse of what awaits all of us who remain faithful to Christ. The Saints we honor are those who have heard Jesus, remained faithful to the demands of discipleship, and now rejoice in heaven. This Feast is a reminder that each of us is called to be a saint. While we may think that we have to be perfect and sainthood is beyond our reach, the Saints that have gone before us give us hope and show us that sainthood is achievable for everyone. Of the many examples of saints (Augustine, Francis, Padre Pio, Katherine Drexel, Edith Stein) that we can look to we are privileged to have had three modern-day saints walk among us: Pope Saint John Paul, Saint Teresa of Calcutta and Pope Saint John XXIII. They faced the realities and hardships of life: division in their communities, division in their families, even division in their own lives, turbulent times in the history of the church and of the world, yet they persevered and now stand as witnesses and stand with us in our own efforts. The Beatitudes also offer us a path to sainthood, how to live as Christians and in a right relationship between ourselves and God. Each beatitude starts with the word blessed and a step to sainthood in the church is to be designated as blessed – not blessed as the world bestows blessings. They are not the strong, the proud, the owner of great fortune or the powerful. No, they are the poor in spirit, the meek, the peacemakers, those who show mercy, the clean of heart. They are the children of God, united in their humility, their mercy, their pureness of heart. The beatitudes describe qualities, not actions. We are called not only to follow the beatitudes but to become the beatitudes. When we do so we are able to face our weaknesses and, therefore, our need for God and for his mercy. We become aware that we are poor in spirit. We grow in healthy humility. We are blessed God loves us not because we are perfect, none of the saints we celebrate lived perfect lives. God loves us but because he is loving and merciful. When we accept this and imitate that love, we become peacemakers, we become merciful, we become meek of heart, we begin to show mercy and forgiveness to others. We become more like saints!
