Many of us remember the great reflections Father MacDonald gave when he was in our parish for the last two Novena's to St. Ann.

### Telling the Story ...

In his book "A Whole New Mind – Why Right Brainers Will Rule the World" author Daniel Pink devotes a large portion of his book to the importance of telling stories as an effective means of communication.

In this week's Gospel while Jesus continues to explain everything in private to his disciples, he takes a different approach for us. Jesus teaches us in a way that we are able to understand it - he uses stories and creative imagery so that we are able to see how present and active God is in our daily lives.

In the growing parable Jesus reveals two essential truths about living as one of his followers.

First our growth is dependent on God. The power of growth in the "seeds" does not come from the farmer, it comes from the creator. So it goes with us – as our knowledge increases and we become more advanced technologically it is easy to arrive at the false sense that we are in charge of everything. But that is not the case, just as the farmer cannot make a rock grow into a tomato plant, we cannot grow without the transformative grace of God that grows in us.

Second, growth in holiness (life in communion with God) is a gradual process. Unlike the overnight success stories, we hear about our ability to achieve wisdom, joy and virtue comes through a patient and consistent effort to cooperate with God – to be in this for the long haul. But we live in a culture that is built on the shaky foundation of instant gratification and that is why discouragement is one of the devil's favorite approaches. If our prayer life doesn't produce spiritual fireworks right away, if our challenges are not gone overnight, we tend to become disillusioned and back off in our efforts. Our ability to be a full-grown healthy plant that nourishes those around us relies on patience and an unshakable confidence in God.

We can even add a third truth: spiritual growth takes time. Imagine a farmer or gardener standing out in the field and yelling at some recently planted seeds: "Grow faster, grow faster!" Or the same farmer or gardener constantly pulling the plants out of the ground once they are growing to check their roots? Sounds ridiculous but isn't that what we do when we scream at our seeds to speed up their growth.

With these parables what Jesus is really trying to teach us is for us to learn and recognize his voice speaking in our hearts and minds. He wants us to always live in his presence, for us to become the largest of plants and put forth large branches, to make our lives into what God created them to be.
