God so Loves the World!

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Think about where we last saw this verse from our Gospel this week? It is likely it may have been on a billboard or a sign at a sporting event. Why is John 3:16 so popular?

Because, more than just a catchphrase this verse is the sum and summary of our salvation history. It is our message of hope that through Jesus Christ, all of our transgressions before God are washed away in God's mercy. Sin and death are overcome through Jesus' sacrifice of love on the cross.

The message that the world sorely needs to hear is that God loves us and offers salvation through Jesus to everyone, but he loves us so much that he grants us the freedom to accept or reject his love.

At the heart of our faith throughout the world is the cross (which is bare), and the crucifix (which is the cross with the body of Jesus affixed to it). Each, in their own particular way symbolize and signify the redemptive action of Jesus Christ.

The crosses and crucifixes that we wear around our necks and that hang in our churches and homes show us just how much God loves us, how much he has always loved us, and his desire for a relationship with us.

As we continue our Lenten journey, perhaps let's spend some time thinking about that. And in doing so, let's also reflect on what, in our own lives, demonstrates how much we love God in return.
