

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON JERRY

We Are Family!...The 1979 Pittsburgh pirates rallied around a theme from a popular song in the late 70's titled "We are Family" They faced adversity and overcame seemingly insurmountable obstacles to win the World Series because they pulled together and really believed they were family. All of us belong to the family of God – so you can say we are family! Our first two readings today present us with the best case scenario of how holy families might live. But realistically many people experience family life otherwise. Many families experience emotional pain or suffering and family members are often regretful and remorseful over past experiences and decisions. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph faced challenges as well hardship and danger in their lives - yet we see in our Gospel they remained open to God's faithful presence and guidance. Holiness is not defined by a perfect life but by a responsive one. Holiness doesn't mean the absence of difficulties and tensions but a willingness to grow in our ability to care for, to forgive, to love, to teach, and to admonish one another. To be holy is to listen to and follow the will of God and to act in the direction of what is right and good for ourselves. Willie Stargell, who was the most popular player on those 1979 Pirates, said after they won the World Series: "There are really no words to put into the way I feel. We had to scratch, we had to crawl, and we did it together because we are family." We will have to scratch and crawl at times. Our challenge going forward is to be like the Holy Family and keep Christ at the center of our lives and our homes. Our challenge is to let the word of Christ dwell in us – to let it guide our decisions and daily lives even if that means swimming upstream and going against the norms of our popular culture or speaking up against injustices. Most of all our challenge going forward is to maintain our relationship with Jesus Christ who loved Mary and Joseph and who was always obedient to the will of his Father. What made the Holy Family a holy family? In spite of the problems they faced, in spite of the fact things were not always perfect they did their best, and remained faithful to God's guidance. May we do the same and in word and deed and let us resolve to keep Christ as the center of our lives. We are family!
