Seventeenth Sunday Ordinary Time - Nineth Sunday after Pentecost in Latin Mass

5 Loaves and 2 Fish! ... Beginning this week and for the next several Sundays we will be hearing the Bread of Life discourse from the Gospel of John. In this week's passage we see that with almost no resources Jesus was resolved to feed the people. When the boy and the apostles hand over their paltry resources to the Jesus they become more than enough to do the job. In fact, when he was done the scraps were more than what he started with. The lesson is very simple: Jesus wants to feed us and he wants us to feed others. He wants to work the same miracle of feeding the hungry crowd and someone has to provide the bread and fish. That someone is us. Our bread and fish come in the form of the talents and gifts we have - some great, some small. But each of us has the ability to use our gifts to feed others and have an impact on this world. Often we think there is little if anything we can do to make a difference.

A while ago I encountered Jessica a young woman who was distraught over a family that she knew had fallen on hard times. The family was in desperate need for some help with medical expenses as well as basic needs. Jessica said "I feel God pulling at my heart telling me I have to do something to help this family." Jessica was 13 years old! She decided to set up a lemonade stand to raise money and as you can guess there were many naysayers. How much do you think you can raise? You need permits to do this sort of thing. No one wants lemonade from a stand, that is so old-school! Jessica's response: "I am doing it anyway! I will put it in Jesus' hands and go for it." She raised in excess of 1500 dollars. She had no corporate sponsors, no one to underwrite her efforts, no marketing plan. Just five loaves and two fish along with her desire and love which she gave to the Lord.

The same goes for all of us as Christian disciples. We look into the world and we may see selfishness, greed that rage in the human heart. We see corruption, hunger, homelessness, and the many other problems we face in life. Don't we all at some time feel overcome by the magnitude of these problems and feel helpless? Of course we do? Can we make a difference? When we hand it over to Jesus you bet we can. Jessica, with the love of Christ raging in her heart did it with only 5 loaves and 2 fish. So can we.

When we put what we have into the hands of Jesus, trusting in him and not just ourselves, then can we hope to make a real difference - in our hearts and in society at large. Every small act of charity and love adds up so eventually there is more than enough for everyone. What we could never achieve on our own, we can immeasurably surpass with God. Jesus is always looking out for us, always keeping an eye out to feed our hungry hearts. He tells us I will feed you with the Bread of Life and I am sending you out to feed others. What will each of us do with our 5 loaves and two fish?
