Sixteenth Sunday Ordinary Time - Eighth Sunday after Pentecost in Latin Mass

A very special welcome to Redemptorist Father Denis Sweeney from Washington, D.C., who is our guest preacher, confessor and celebrant for the nine days. Daily Masses will be celebrated Monday through Friday at 8:30 a.m. and 7 p.m.; Saturday Masses are 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m.; and Sunday Masses are 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. Please note that the 11:00 am Sunday mass has been moved to St. Ann this week and next. A very special welcome to our visitors who are joining us for the Novena.

Please note that beginning on Sunday, July 25 the 9:30 am Latin Mass time will be permanently moved to 9:00 am.

Dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day Masses to end soon ... The Catholic bishops of Pennsylvania have indicated that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass, which went into effect in March 2020 will soon be lifted. Bishop Persico is reinstating the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and holy days beginning on **Sunday, Aug. 15, 2021**, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As always, the obligation does not apply to those with serious illness or health risks, as well as their caregivers. We look forward to having everyone back soon and will be communicating more information in the near future regarding plans on returning to more of a sense of pre-pandemic parish life.

World Day for Grandparents and Elderly ... Pope Francis has established the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, to be held each year on the fourth Sunday of July. The Best Laid Plans! ... Most of us have heard at one time or another that "If you want to make God laugh, tell Him your plans." We all make plans. We have plans for our families, school plans, plans at work, travel plans, and many more. Even our fun times are planned. When we make these plans, we have good intentions but alas, our best-laid plans are often changed and de-railed and too often stolen from us. In our Gospel, the Apostles who had been out preaching all day had come back to Jesus with plans of their own, to get some much-needed rest. They needed a break, so Jesus decided it was time to get away and get some rest. But as they approached the opposite shore, they saw a large crowd and heard the noisy voices of people. Their plans were totally disrupted as they now had to tend to the needs of the crowd. You can imagine how those Apostles felt. No doubt they were disappointed and somewhat annoyed by this disruption. What is our reaction when our plans are disrupted? How do treat those who we perceive as getting in the way of what we want to get done? Do we resent them and make their life miserable? Jesus endured many disruptions and setbacks in his earthly ministry, but he turned these moments into blessings for those he encountered. In our Gospel account, he got out of the boat even though he was weary and needed a break, went into the crowd, and ministered to them. "So, as he stepped ashore, he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length." Jesus did not get irritated or send them away. Instead, he gave them his tender and caring love. We are called to do the same – in spite of what we may have planned, God may want us to give our caring love to someone else, even if that means putting our own plans on hold. Our lesson is that God's agenda and our own agenda may not always be the same. God has plans for us, and when they come to bear in our lives, we might have to make some adjustments to our own plans. God is a God of surprises, just as he is a God who gives us unplanned opportunities to show what we're made of. Let us always take these opportunities to respond to him and others in patience and humility, and with love. Let us always strive to make God's ways our ways.
