A safe and **Happy Memorial Day** to everyone. This day is more than a federal holiday or the unofficial start to summer rather it is a special time to pray for and honor the military personnel who have died in the performance of their military duties while serving in the United States Armed Forces.

United in Love

What is the one thing that we do frequently when we pray? We make the sign of the cross. We do it to remind us of our baptism and also to remind us of the presence of the triune God or the Trinity - the God to whom we belong.

Today on Trinity Sunday we celebrate one of the most fundamental beliefs of Christianity: The Father, The Son, and the Holy Spirit - three distinct, divine coequal persons in one God. Even for the Church, the Trinity is considered a mystery and there are aspects of it we will never fully grasp while we are this side of heaven. But it is something that we hold as revealed truth.

Yet while the Trinity is a theological mystery it is not a puzzle for us to solve. While we may never comprehend its totality, we do experience its presence and accept its reality.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that God himself is an external exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and he destines for us to share in that exchange. The Trinity dwells in us and it began when we were baptized, it was the words and water (I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit) that brought us into the family of God and, raised us to the dignity of sharing in divine life and carrying out the work of God here on earth.

It is the Trinity's divine life that is in us that enables us as weak human beings to carry out the work of God. Just as the three persons of the Holy Trinity are perfectly united in a oneness of love, we are called to live in ever-greater love and unity with God and one another by doing good for others, being persons of integrity, and by continuing to be good disciples of Jesus. How different the world would be if every Christian lived out the divine life within us and followed the examples Jesus gave us: Patience, kindness, determined love, and attention to the needs of those around us in all circumstances.

When we make the sign of the cross, or when we say the "Glory Be" let us make it a true prayer to the Holy Trinity to serve as a model for how we are to live. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are perfectly united in a oneness of love, may we endeavor to continually to live in ever-greater love and unity with God and one another.
