





Whether you are a young family or you are "empty nesters", we invite you to celebrate Advent with our parish family!

Advent is a word with Latin roots. It means "approach" or "coming."

Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year for the Roman Catholic Church. On the first Sunday of Advent, which begins on December 1st this year, the Church celebrates its own kind of New Year's

Day. Advent begins each year on the Sunday closest to November 30th, which is the feast day of Saint Andrew the Apostle.
