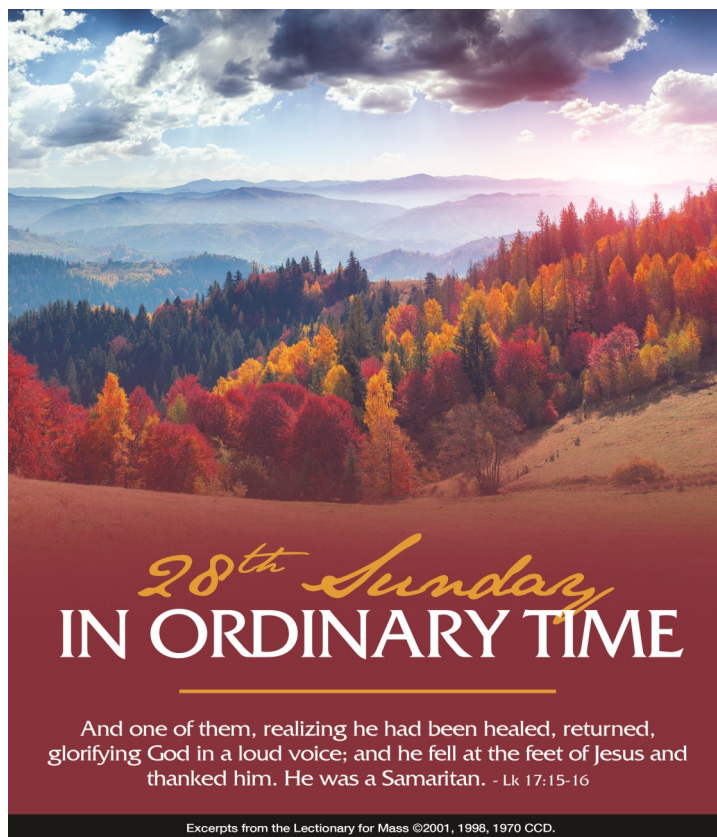

What is "Our Lady's Labyrinth",  
located behind the Church?



The Labyrinth is a Sacred Path. It is a circular path that winds into the center, the way in is the same as the way out. There is no right or wrong way to walk a labyrinth. Each person uses the labyrinth in any way that meets their need. Generally there are three stages to the walk: releasing on the way in, receiving in the center and returning, taking into the world that which you have received. People come to labyrinths for a multitude of reason. Some say they experience guidance or feel a sense of grace, others say they receive a gift, new insight, feeling or idea. Walking the labyrinth is about allowing the presence of God to lead you. Like the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, and other devotions, the labyrinth is a tool for prayer and meditation.
