Council Chatter:

CHARTER OF THE PASTORAL COUNCIL **OUR LADY QUEEN OF THE AMERICAS CHURCH**

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1:

Registered, confirmed and practicing catholic adults (18 years or older) of Our Lady Queen of the Americas shall be eligible to serve on Council as regular members.

SECTION 2:

Announcements requesting volunteers to fill open seats on Council will be publicized in the Church Bulletin during April. We currently have one (1) open seat on Council. If there are more volunteers than seats available, an election will take place on the third Sunday in May. Tie votes in an election shall be resolved by the flip of a coin. If there are an insufficient number of volunteers, additional volunteers will be solicited each month until all seats are filled.

SECTION 3:

The Pastoral Council shall be composed of no more than nine (9) regular members, and such other members as shall be appointed. Regular members shall serve for a term of three (3) years beginning with the church fiscal year (July to June). The terms of the regular members shall be staggered so that one-third of the membership shall be filled each year. Regular and appointed members shall voice their consensus at Pastoral Council meetings, but only regular members shall hold the office of President and Vice President. No regular member may succeed him or herself more than once. Should a regular member resign or be removed from council, additional volunteers will be solicited to fill their unexpired term.

What is Spiritual Communion?

"Spiritual Communion is a centuries-old Christian practice of desiring union with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. It is used

as a preparation for Holy Mass and by individuals who cannot receive Holy Communion."

Spiritual Communion can be made in simple words of one's own or by using prayers already written by saints and other spiritual guides.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Make your physical location special by placing objects and images that remind you of God's love on a table (e.g. candle, sacred art, statue, flower, photo, etc.). If praying with children, ask them to contribute items.

Make the area around you as quiet as possible or play music that helps you focus on God's presence
