# WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS St. Blaise

On St. Blaise's day, February 3, many Catholic communities offer a blessing of throats. the custom began in the sixteenth century, although Blaise is thought to have died about the year 320.

Little is known with certainty about his life, but Blaise lived in Armenia, where he is remembered as a bishop. To escape the persecution of Christians under the emperor Licinius, Blaise hid in a cave. Wild animals thronged to him because he healed their sick, according to a legend.

Eventually, the legend continues, hunters discovered him and took him to civil authorities. On the way he rescued a poor woman's pig from the mouth of a hungry wolf. Unmoved, the anti-Christian authorities imprisoned Blaise. The grateful pig-owner brought him candles to brighten his cell. While in jail, Blaise miraculously dislodged a fishbone from a boy's throat. The memory of these events — the use of candles and the healing of a throat — influenced later devotions. Blaise was tortured with the iron combs used to card the wool of sheep. Then he was beheaded.

Blaise is the patron of those with sore throats. On his day the faithful are blessed with this prayer: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from diseases of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." The minister offering the prayer holds two unlit candles in the form of an X against the bare throat of the recipient. Anyone may invoke this blessing. If a priest or deacon gives it, he makes the sign of the cross over the faithful to conclude it.

Le Nom du Pere Society meets this Wednesday and we'd love to have more of you join us! Meetings are held on the first Wednesday of the month at Saint Hippolyte Church, usually at 7:00pm. Come a little earlier to enjoy food and fellowship before the meeting begins. All are welcome.


Lately we have been asked..."Why does Le Nom du Pere have so many fundraisers and where does the money go?" Here's some things we have been able to accomplish over the last two years or so.

We raised \$1,145 with our holiday bake sales and \$830 at the recent chicken and biscuit dinner. A little over \$6,000 was the profit from our last two garage sales. We enjoy providing meals following the funeral Mass of parishioners and those grateful families have donated over \$900 to the society. Our profit from last year's French Dinner was \$1,088.

We've recently given a little over \$2,000 to parishioners and local families in need, including St. James Haven homeless shelter for men. We cover the cost of receptions and socials after Mass for various activities and in honor of our First Communion and Confirmation students and our high school graduates, along with a small gift to them. We also provide supplies like paper products and drinks for social Sundays and Soup & Bread meals. Costs of these social activities that LNDP provides for the parish, as well as the funeral luncheons have amounted to well over \$3,000. Le Nom du Pere Society also provides Christmas gifts to our parish shut-ins, priests, deacons and parish staff; these have totaled just over \$900. The society also organized and provided paint and supplies for the recent painting of the social hall lobby and restrooms at Saint Hippolyte which cost over \$500. \$1,000 has been spent for liturgical needs, such as artificial Christmas trees, dry cleaning of vestments, an ablution cup, and church cleaning supplies. We've also spent over \$1,000 on the Little Books for Advent and Lent, and bibles for the Faith Formation students.

Additionally, Le Nom du Pere Society has organized 15 Reverse Raffles (and the Take a Chance Raffle during the Covid-19 shutdown) which have generated \$168,685 for the parish. All proceeds went directly into the parish budget.

As you can see, we have been quite busy over the last two years. Everything we do is for the good of the parish and to build up our Christian community. It would be great to have more people attend the meetings to help decide how to raise money and spend it in the future. Won't you come and join us? We'd love to spend time with you in prayer and in good works.
