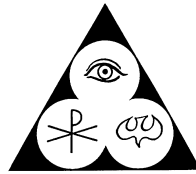

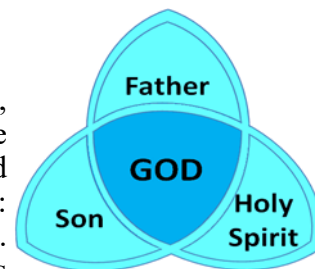
CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS—Listen to your children:

Above all, communicate your safety concerns to your children. Make sure they know that they can come to you with any concerns they may have about the people they interact with. And if you hear of or observe behaviors that may be inappropriate, make sure to communicate your feelings to people who are in a position to intervene. WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

TRINITY



Today is Trinity Sunday, which is celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost and celebrates the Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Today we are to give thanks for all the Trinity has done to save us from our sins. The Gospel of Matthew (28:19) is the only one of the four Gospels that Jesus gives instructions to the disciples to go out and baptize “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”

Also we can be thankful that today is the first Sunday that Bishop Persico has given us permission to gather in our churches with some guidelines which you received in the mail last week.

The Trinity celebrates the three persons of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. This is one of the most difficult concepts of Christianity to understand. It is important for Christians because it is central to our worship and what we believe, that is of a God who is incomprehensible. Trinity Sunday has been celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost from as early as the 10th century. Some people have used a three leaf clover or a triangle to explain the Trinity to children.

Like the three persons of the Trinity, may WE become united in PEACE AND LOVE, through the Holy Spirit.
