WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS



Grief is usually associated with death but it occurs with many events in our life which can cause a sense of deep loss, of life or life experiences.

We have had many people who have died this past year and it has affected each of us in a different way. Grief is a response to a loss, particularly to the loss of someone or something that has died of which a deep bond was formed. Grief is a strong emotion, maybe from the loss of a loved one or from a terminal illness or diagnosis they may have received and grief is the reaction to the loss. The most well known person for her understanding of grief was Elisabeth Kubler Ross M.D. (1926-2004) and her five stages of grief were:

- **Denial**-the bereaved having difficulty believing what has happened.
- Anger-questioning the fairness of the loss.
- **Bargaining**-wishing to make a deal for the one who was lost.
- **Depression**-the period when the bereaved get in touch with their sadness.
- **Acceptance**-feeling some resolution to their grief and an ability to go on with their life.

Grief is common and is a normal feeling that you may experience after the death of a loved one. But any major loss, such as job loss, loss of a home, loss of friendship, etc. can cause us grief. Symptoms of grief can be emotional, physical, or religious in nature. Usually holidays will trigger an emotional sense of loss and can be eased with counseling by a professional, either medical or religious.

Prayer for a loved one:

I commend you, my dear (name) to almighty God and entrust you to your creator. May you rest in the arms of the Lord who formed you from the dust of the earth. May holy Mary, the angels, and all the saints welcome you now that you have gone forth from this life. May Christ who was crucified for you, bring you to freedom and peace. May Christ who died for you, admit you into his garden of paradise. May Christ the true Shepherd, embrace you as one of his flock. May he forgive all of your sins and set you among those he has chosen. May you see your Redeemer face to face and enjoy the vision of God forever. Amen.
