WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS



ADVENT is the season that begins our new church year and is our time of waiting and preparation for the Nativity of Christ. The Season of Advent begins today and concludes on December 24. Advent prepares us for the real meaning of Christmas and helps us to prepare for celebrating the coming of Christ.

Many of us use the Advent wreath in our homes and celebrate each week. The four candles represent Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. This is the order for lighting them in your home. The Advent Wreath is only one of our ways of celebrating the Advent Season. A new option will be provided to you this year. Our Parish Advisory Council decided to provide each family with a 3 month subscription to Magnificat. This book is a spiritual guide to use with your family and will be mailed to your home. Another resource available for you is the *Little Blue Book* provided to us each year by Le Nom Du Pere Society. These books are available at each church for you to pick up. There are also many on -line resources for you to use during Advent. EWTN offers reflections by Fr. Joseph Mary Wolfe, Chaplain at EWTN. You can find this resource by visiting www.ewtn.com/advent. Another great on-line resource is from Dynamic Catholic. Let your Soul Shine with Matthew Kelly provides a daily Gospel reading and reflection beginning on November 29. Have Your Best Advent Ever by visiting www.dynamiccatholic.com.

One of our parish Advent traditions has been the Christ -kindel Advent name exchange. Due to the pandemic and CDC guidelines, we are not able practice that tradition this year. We would like to suggest that you choose someone who you feel is in need of your prayers during this pandemic. Pray for them daily and send them a "thinking of you" card once or twice throughout the Advent season. Do not disclose your identity until Christmas, just as we have done for our Chris-kindel in the past. This activity can be as creative as your ideas are! We look forward to hearing your many happy stories from this activity.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath

It's time to bring out and bless the Advent wreath! The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

Use this prayer to bless your family wreath:

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord. Response (R/.) Who made heaven and earth. Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read:

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:

he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,

he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,

he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us

as we light the candles of this wreath.

May the wreath and its light

be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.
