WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS EASTER SEASON 2022

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy.

This year The Sacred Paschal Triduum was celebrated at Our Lady of Lourdes Church. On Holy Thursday we celebrated the last supper with our traditional dinner together as a parish family and then proceeded with the Mass of the Lord's We presented the Holy Oils that were Supper. blessed at St. Peter's Cathedral during the Chrism Mass on Monday of Holy Week. We then continued with the washing of feet and the institution of the Eucharist, followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. On Friday we gathered again at Our Lady of Lourdes for the Good Friday Service (not a Mass) at 3:00pm to remember the Crucifixion of Christ, which represents good over evil, sin, and death. On Holy Saturday we gathered around the fire to begin the Service of Light and then processed into the church to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ. Following the Easter Vigil Mass we gathered into the social hall for our annual Break—Fast celebration with lots of good food and On Easter Sunday we gathered for fellowship. Mass at the usual Sunday Mass times at Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Hippolyte.

The Easter season did **NOT** end with Easter Sunday but continued this week with the Octave of Easter and through Pentecost Sunday. During this time of the Easter Season our third graders will celebrate the Sacrament of Eucharist for their very first time: Grace Carless, Waylon Kalinowski, Lucy McGowan and Lilly Terrill.

Our eleventh grade students celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation April 5th as they were confirmed by Bishop Lawrence Persico at The Epiphany of the Lord Parish, Saint Agatha Church in Meadville: Brionna Burnette, Joseph Grundy, Abigail Knapka, Brennen McWright, Chase Miller, Andrea Palotas, Jack Rynd and Ella White.

BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER

Our Knights of Columbus council has joined all the other councils in Erie and Crawford Counties to conduct a Baby Bottle fundraising drive to benefit the Women's Care Center of Erie's goal of purchasing a mobile ultrasound van. This medically equipped vehicle will visit rural areas, as well as our five local Universities to provide valuable lifesaving services.

In 2021, the K of C provided an ultrasound machine to the Care Center, and in less than a year 63 previously abortion bound women chose life for their unborn children, after viewing them on this state of the art machine. While this is certainly an achievement, we are now focusing on helping to raise \$250,000 to purchase a mobile ultrasound van. If the K of C along with other entities is able to achieve this goal, the K of C Supreme council in Connecticut will pay the entire cost of the mobile ultrasound machine, amounting to about \$45,000.

Baby bottles will be distributed as you leave church on Mothers Day. If you are financially able, we ask that you fill them with change, currency or checks and return them on Fathers Day. All proceeds will go to the purchase of the mobile ultrasound van.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Since the Diocese of Erie was established on July 29, 1853, we have been blessed with many men who have devoted their lives to the priesthood. These priests have faithfully served and led the faithful in living out their lives as Catholics.

When a priest is ordained, he takes on the pastoral responsibility for the lives of others. Pope Francis encourages us: "Dear people of God, be close to your priests with affection and with your prayers, that they may be shepherds according to God's heart. And pray for those whom God is calling to be priests that they may respond to this call with humility and joy."
