WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

ARCHANGELS

Every September 29 the Catholic Church celebrates a feast of three archangels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. The word *archangel* appears once in the Bible, in reference to Michael (Jude 9). Tradition has added the other two names to the list because both play significant roles with him in the bible.

Raphael appears in the Book of Tobit, where he is both matchmaker and healer. Gabriel is best known for his appearances in the New Testament. He announces to Zechariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist (Luke 1:13, 19) and most famously he announces to Mary that she will conceive Jesus (Luke 1:26-38).

Michael appears in the Book of Daniel as a defender of the chosen people (see chapters 10 and 12). In Jude he disputes with the devil over the body of Moses. And in Revelation he and his angels fight the dragon. Michael is the patron of police and others who protect the welfare of people.

No church had even been dedicated to Michael until the sixth century, when the faithful erected one on the Via Salaria in Rome. It was dedicated on September 29, which became the Feast of St. Michael on the Roman calendar. The other two archangels were added to this day after the Second Vatican The Collect for the Mass stresses two functions of the archangels: they defend the Christian people, and they minister to God in heaven.

A fourth archangel, Uriel, is acknowledged in Christian tradition, though he does not appear in the Bible, and hence has no place on the liturgical calendar. The Apocryphal gospels say he carried John the Baptist and his mother Elizabeth to join Jesus, Mary and Joseph on the flight into Egypt. Uriel is one of the characters in Leonardo de Vinci's masterpiece, Virgin of the Rocks.

In this year dedicated to Eucharistic Revival in the Parish, we thought it would be good to refresh our understanding of how and why we receive Communion. When we receive **Eucharistic** Communion, we observe a fast for one hour beforehand. That means eating and drinking nothing except for water and medicine. We do this out of respect for God, whom we are united with in the Host. This includes gum, which has its own juice.

The whole point of Jesus' coming to earth was to reunite us with God. When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, we are united with Him - physical contact with the 2nd Person of the Blessed Trinity - for just a few minutes. Even if our senses can't detect this Union, this is a foretaste of Heaven, an act of faith, hope, and love that we will be one with Him forever. Take time to marvel at this Mystery!

Le Nom du Pere Society does not keep any of the profit, but rather does the planning and organizing. Last year's profit was over \$16,000. This parish event is only successful due to the support and generosity of our parishioners!

What is a Reverse Raffle?

When you buy a ticket for a "reverse" raffle, you will be hoping that your ticket is the LAST one drawn! The last one to be pulled will be the big winner. We sell only 150 tickets. A \$45.00 ticket will provide you with a lovely dinner for two and a chance at the \$1,000 grand prize! If your ticket is pulled early in the raffle you will win a smaller prize (which is why we are asking families to donate "loser" prizes), but your fun is certainly not over at that point. In addition to the main board worth \$1,000, we will be selling "side-board" tickets for \$3.00, \$5.00 and \$10.00 per ticket with chances to win \$225, \$375 and \$750 on those boards. Tickets for the side-boards will go on sale at 6:00pm that evening. You will also have the opportunity to purchase tickets to win other great prizes as well as playing bingo (winner splits the pot with the house) and a huge 50/50. Some of the great prizes that will be given away on November 4th include: a Crossbow, a 36" Blackstone Griddle, a \$500 cash pizza, a king-sized handmade quilt, \$100 in Scratch off Lottery Tickets, with even more items to be added. You can only purchase tickets on these prizes if you attend the raffle! Since this is a gambling event, guests must be at least 18 years of age to attend. Beer will be provided for those over age 21, but feel free to bring your own favorite beverages. Soda and water are also provided. This is a great Christian community building activity as well as a wonderful (and greatly needed) fundraiser for our parish.

Once again we are asking for the help of every parish family. We need you to donate new items as prizes to be given to the "losers." If every family gave one or two prizes, we would be in great shape! Some examples of prizes that you could donate are: Gift Cards for gas, restaurants, shopping, movies, haircuts, etc.; Camping, Hunting or Fishing Items; Golf Items; Theme Baskets; Family Games; Kitchen Gadgets or Small Appliances; Live Plants or Silk Floral Arrangements; Holiday Decorations; Lawn & Garden Items; Bottles of Wine or other beverages; Sweatshirts, Jackets, Hats, T-Shirts; Tools; Car Care Items; Anything that you would like to win! Ideally, we like the loser prizes to have at least a \$20 value, but smaller items can be combined with others. Your small investment will be returned to the church ten-fold. Prizes can be brought to the church any Sunday morning, or call the parish office if you need to drop something off during the week. We'll even come and pick it up—just call Desi at the office. **These prizes need to be at Saint Hippolyte Church no later than Sunday, October 29th in order to be included in the printed program that is distributed at the raffle.** The committee will need to shop for prizes if we don't receive enough, so please turn in your donations no later than October 29.
