Child **Protection** and Creating Safe Environments- Bystanders can help. Bystanders can play a big role in stopping bullying. When people do nothing, it sends a message that it's no big deal to bully. If people say something, it sends a social message that bullying is not OK. If you see someone being bullied, you can help by doing these things: Speak up to help: If it feels safe and natural to speak up, say, "come on, let's get out of here" to the person being bullied. It is okay to let the bully know people are watching and will get involved. Report it: Let a trusted adult know what you witnessed. This isn't tattling, it is standing up for what's right. Offer support: Check in with the person who was being bullied. Ask how they are doing. Remind them that the bullying is not their fault. For additional resources visit

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS



Ash Wednesday officially begins the Season of Lent. This year Ash Wednesday is on February 22, which is 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40 day season (not counting the Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and almsgiving. The 40 days represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, and focusing on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

During Mass on Ash Wednesday the priest will share a sermon that is penitential and reflective on the meaning of Lent. During the Mass ashes are placed on the forehead of those in attendance to remind us to repent and fast for the 40 days. Where do the ashes come from? They usually come from burning the palm from the previous Palm Sunday. The ashes of this prayerful day symbolize two main things: death and repentance. Ashes represent dust and when a human corpse decomposes, it returns to ashes or dust. When we come forward for ashes, we are saying we are sorry for our sins, and that we want the season of Lent to correct our faults, purify our hearts, control our desires and grow in holiness so we can celebrate Easter with great joy.

We as parishioners of St. Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish are offered many ways to follow the Lenten season. For example,

- by praying the Stations of the Cross on Wednesday evenings, following our soup and bread meals
- by following the scripture passages and reflections in the *Little Black Book*
- by participating in CRS Operation Rice Bowl
- by downloading the *Hallow* app and pray every day this Lent
- by participating in Matthew Kelly's *Best Lent Ever* at www.dynamiccatholic.com

How are you preparing for Easter?

Soup & Bread and Stations of the Cross will be held on Wednesdays during Lent. Soup & Bread begins at 6:15pm and Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7:00pm, alternating weeks between the two churches of our parish. Sign up sheets are posted on the bulletin boards for volunteers to bring soup and bread, as well as set-up and clean-up each week. Please check the bulletin board and sign up as you can. **Volunteers are needed to lead the Stations of the Cross:** at Saint Hippolyte on March 15 and 29 and at Our Lady of Lourdes on March 8. Please contact the parish office if you are available to lead our prayer on any of those dates.

NOTICE – LENTEN PRACTICES 2023

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2023. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish.

- Traditional Lenten practices of PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING, and other forms
 of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly
 encouraged.
- 2. **ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT,** and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of **abstinence** from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.
- 3. In 2023, St. Patrick's Day (March 17 Principal Patronal Feast Day of the Diocese of Erie) falls on a Friday in Lent. In recognition of the importance of this day for the faithful, Bishop Persico has dispensed all Latin Catholics from the requirement of abstinence from eating meat on March 17, 2023, within the territory of the Diocese of Erie.
- 4. **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY** are also days of <u>fasting</u> for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
- 5. On **HOLY THURSDAY**, no celebration of the Mass is to begin anywhere in the diocese earlier than 4:30 pm without the explicit approval of Bishop Persico.
- 6. Although it does not include the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by its very nature the **GOOD FRIDAY** service is celebrated by a priest only.
- 7. All celebrations of the **EASTER VIGIL** are to begin *after nightfall* (which is defined as approximately one hour after local sunset.) Nightfall is about 9:00 pm this year. To balance pastoral need and liturgical prescriptions, Bishop Persico has decreed that the Easter Vigil in the Diocese of Eric is to begin at 8:30 pm or any later time. Any start time earlier than 8:30 pm must receive explicit approval from the Bishop.
