Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments—Know the Warning Signs of a Predator: Those who abuse children look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that we should know to avoid. Rather, most abusers are known to the child, such as the parent, sibling, parent's paramour, parent's spouse, other relative or babysitter. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

FAITH FORMATION IN CHRIST

Faith should be celebrated, lived and expressed in Prayer and Catechesis. When proper catechesis takes place with youth or adults there are phases of faith formation according to *the National Directory for Catechesis*, which is published by the U. S. Catholic Bishops.

Jesus formed his disciples by making known to them the various dimensions of the Kingdom of God... Christ's method of faith formation is for knowledge of our faith.

1. Faith formation is knowing of Faith and is knowing Christ in Scripture and Tradition and Creed.
2. Faith formation is knowledge of Liturgy and Sacraments which makes it possible to receive the Eucharist as living flesh and precious blood. In other words believing that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist.
3. Faith formation promotes moral formation in Christ and encourages us to give witness both in our private lives and public lives.
4. Faith formation invites the Christian to live in community and to participate actively in the life of the church. To participate means to educate our children in the practices of our faith through our Faith Formation classes and participating in the life of the church.
5. Faith formation teaches us to pray with Christ, such as the Our Father.
6. Faith formation promotes a missionary spirit which prepares us to be present in society. We need to witness both in word and deed. We need to evangelize like Christ; to be present to the poor and compassionate in welcoming immigrants.

These tasks make us disciples of Christ and all are necessary in developing our Christian Faith.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Holy Father is constantly encouraging us to remember the poor and the marginalized. In his Homily on World Day of the Poor last year the Pope prayed: "Rouse us, Lord, from our idle calm, from the quiet lull of our safe harbors. Set us free from the moorings of self-absorption that weigh life down; free us from constantly seeking success. I ask your generous response to the Collection for National Needs on July 17-18. Your help does make a difference.

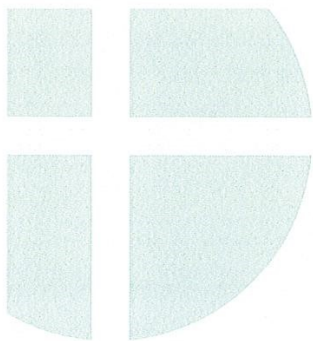

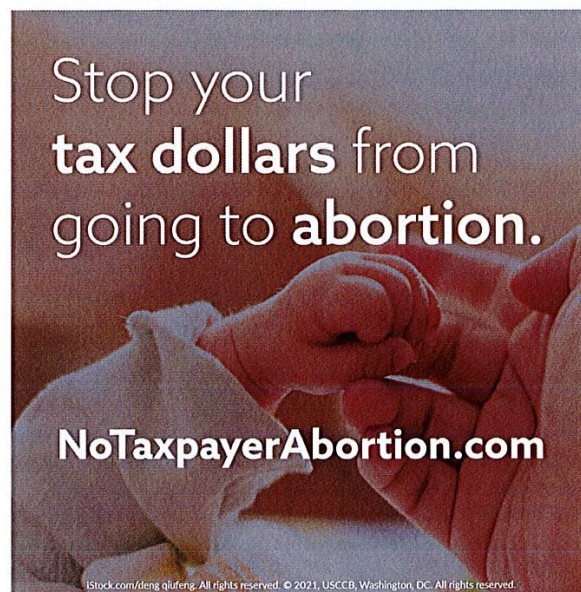
