WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS FAITH FORMATION UPDATE

This year due to the pandemic and after consulting with other Faith Formation programs in the diocese, we decided it would be safer to do a home program. We also changed to the *Pflaum* program because of the weekly worksheets rather than textbooks. This program from *Pflaum* had four different sessions (dated for September, November, January and March) which were picked up or mailed to each student/family. These lessons are easy to follow and they also provide you with a one-on-one opportunity to share in your child's faith formation. It has always been the teaching of the RC Church that parents are the first educators of their children, so we are asking that you work with your children using these weekly lessons.

At the beginning of the school year parents received a packet with registration forms to be completed and returned to us. Also included in the packet was information for parents to review with their children regarding safe environments and child protection, with forms to be completed for this as well. If you haven't already done so, please complete these forms and return them either in the collection basket or by mail to the parish office.

During this time of pandemic, the United States bishops lifted the obligation to attend Mass. On June 1st Bishop Persico permitted parishes in the Diocese of Erie to once again hold public Masses, with the proper CDC guidelines in place. He also gave permission for Catholics to continue watching Mass on television or on-line. Hopefully, those who have not been attending Mass in person have still been watching and participating in these Masses each week. Change is difficult but we need to stay connected with our faith and be engaged in our children's faith development.

Last Sunday we held a retreat for our 11th grade Confirmation Journey students. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on May 12 at 7:00pm at Saint Agatha Church in Meadville. There will soon be a meeting for the 9th grade Confirmation Journey students, their sponsors and parents. There will also be a retreat for the 9th and 10th grade students. These dates have not yet been set.

We have scheduled a retreat for First Reconciliation on March 20 at Saint Hippolyte, which will include the celebration of First Reconciliation. Our First Eucharist retreat at Saint Hippolyte will on April 24 followed by the celebration of First Eucharist at Saint Hippolyte on April 25. The First Eucharist retreat at Our Lady of Lourdes will be on May 1 followed by the celebration of First Eucharist at Our Lady of Lourdes on May 2. The special materials that parents will use to prepare their children for these two sacraments will be distributed today, February 7 following each of the Masses.

Thank you for all of your efforts in teaching and carrying out the practices of our Faith Formation in your family.

NOTICE - LENTEN PRACTICES 2021

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2021. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish. If the COVID situation requires modifications to these practices, those will be communicated as they develop.

- 1. Traditional Lenten practices of **PRAYER**, **FASTING**, and **ALSMGIVING**, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2. **ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT EXCEPT MARCH 19,** and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of <u>abstinence</u> from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older. Because the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19) falls on a Friday of Lent, and solemnities are never days of penance, the faithful are not obliged to abstain from meat on that day.
- 3. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of <u>fasting</u> for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
- 4. On **HOLY THURSDAY**, no celebration of the Mass is to begin anywhere in the diocese earlier than 4:30 pm without the explicit approval of Bishop Persico.
- 5. Although it does not include the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by its very nature the GOOD FRIDAY service is celebrated by a priest only.
- 6. All celebrations of the **EASTER VIGIL** are to begin *after nightfall*. Bishop Persico has decreed that the Easter Vigil in the Diocese of Erie may begin at 8:30 pm or any later time. Any start time earlier than 8:30 pm must receive explicit approval from the Bishop.


