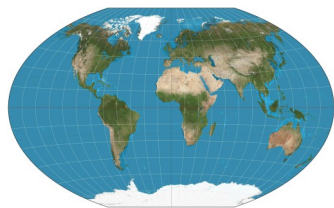

PUBLIC MASSES PERMITTED IN THE DIOCESE OF ERIE AFTER JUNE 1st! However, Mass will not be the same as it was before. Many protocols that we need to follow during this time of pandemic were put into place by Bishop Persico. Here are some of the highlights:

- Please be sure to wear a mask when you come to church. If you forget, we will have a few disposable masks for you to use but please try to remember to bring your own mask in order to save on this expenditure.
- Not all pews will be available for seating. Please respect the restricted seating guidelines that have been put into place for our protection.

All of the requirements for having public Masses were included with the letter from Father Dan which you should have received this week.

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and holy day Mass remains in place. **Mass will continue to be available on the television and on the internet.** The sick and elderly as well as those who are not comfortable with attending a public Mass are encouraged to continue to participate in Mass from their homes and participate in spiritual communion.

PENTECOST

On Pentecost we celebrate the day on which the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in a form resembling tongues of fire, empowering them to proclaim the message that Jesus is risen from the dead. According to Acts of the Apostles (1:13-14), Mary, the apostles, and other disciples had been huddled together in an upper room after the Ascension of Jesus. But on this day they went forth from that room as new people, alive in the Spirit, speaking in tongues and winning over believers by the thousands.

The Mass of Pentecost Sunday is marked by a few special features. The first reading for Saturday's Vigil Mass, for example, is taken from the Old Testament. Throughout the Easter season, all the readings come from the New Testament — except, of course, the responsorial psalm. Saturday's first reading foreshadows the coming of the Spirit. On Sunday the first reading comes from the Acts of the Apostles, and it tells the story of Pentecost. After the second reading, everyone sings or says the Pentecost sequence, a special hymn that tells the meaning of this day.

If the priest uses Eucharistic Prayer I, he inserts a special phrase saying that this is the day on which the Holy Spirit appeared to the apostles. The Mass concludes with a double "alleluia." The deacon or priest adds the words to his dismissal, and you answer, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia." This joyful acclamation concludes the church's celebrating of Easter.

The paschal candle burns throughout the Pentecost Mass, as it does for the 50 days of the Easter season. After Mass, however, it is moved from its place near the ambo to a position in the baptistery.
