WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

HOW DO YOU PRAY?

The purpose of prayer is forming that relationship with our God and the goal of prayer is of having God in our life. There are two kinds of prayer activities: personal and communal. We reach these types of prayer by vocal, mental and liturgical means of prayer. One obstacle in growing with Him and a heart to heart talk that feeds that relationship is in our dialogue with Him. So the question is, how do we do this? What is our part and what is God's part? Let's get ourselves ready to answer these questions.

PERSONAL: We need to spend time alone with God, not just talking but also listening to Him. Just like Jesus tells us in Matthew 6:6, *When you pray go to your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you*". We each need to develop our own style of personal prayer.

COMMUNAL: Each one of us through our Baptism becomes a child of God, which means we are members of God's family. 1 Corinthians 12:12-13 tells us *For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.* When we pray together, we imagine God as the Trinity: Father, Son and Spirit. Our most common communal prayer is the Mass.

We need both personal and communal forms of prayer in our prayer life. So the question for us all is, how am I doing? Can I develop a better relationship with Christ? Remember we don't achieve a good prayer life overnight; sometimes it takes years so don't get discouraged.

As it says in 1 Thessalonians 5:17, *Pray without ceasing.*

CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS—Prevalence of Child Sexual Abuse:



Child sexual abuse is a great deal more prevalent than many imagine. Some studies suggest that as many as one in six boys and one in four girls will be the victim of some form of sexual molestation before the age of 18. That means that, directly or indirectly, child sexual abuse will touch most of us during our lifetime. And although we would like to believe that most accusations are false, the facts tell us that children rarely lie about being molested. In fact, they rarely tell anyone at all. An adult study about the prevalence of sexual abuse found that 42% of men and 33% of women who were victimized as children had never told anyone.
