Here is some trivia about Saint Hippolyte Parish and the Annual Frenchtown Ham or Chicken Dinner:

1833 – The parish was founded by Jean-Nicholas DeMaison (from Voujeaucourt, France) and Jean-Claude Doubet (from Roye, France). (Look for their graves in the parish cemetery).

1834 – Bishop Kendrick from Philadelphia first visits Frenchtown. He gave \$50.00 towards the construction of the first church.

1838 – On August 15, 1838 Bishop Kendrick blessed the first church. This log (?) structure stood on land now occupied by the cemetery. The church was named after the French ancestral church of the Doubet family, Sainte Hippolyte.

1841 – A large hand-carved primitive crucifix was presented to the church by its creator, J.C. Faiver. (This crucifix now hangs in the reconciliation room of Saint Hippolyte.)

1845 – The first resident pastor, Rev. Marc-Antoine de la Roque, is named by the Bishop of Pittsburgh.

1866 – Rev. Eugene Cogneville was named pastor of Saint Hippolyte by the Bishop of Erie. It was during this venerable priest's fifty year tenure that the present church was constructed. (You can visit his grave in the parish cemetery.)

1888 – The first fund raising dinner was held at Saint Hippolyte. On the menu was chicken fricassee. Games, bingo and square dancing to the music of local fiddlers added to the festivities.

1914-1917 – The dinners were interrupted by the First World War. World War II also caused the cancellation of the "Frenchtown Picnic" during the 1940s.

1956 – The menu changes to fried chicken, prepared at the homes of parishioners and brought to the church.

1970 – The dinner was changed to ham for six years due to Department of Health regulations.

1977 – Under the direction of Rev. Richard Mayer, barbecue pits were built and the menu changed for the final time: ½ Bar-B-Q Chicken or a generous portion of Ham, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetable, applesauce, coleslaw, rolls and homemade pies.

2020-2021—Covid-19 concerns prevented the in-person dinner and festival atmosphere. Pre-ordered, carry-out meals with parking lot pick-up helped us carry on our tradition for the 125th dinner to take place in 2021.

COMING HOME

In March of 2020, Bishop Persico dispensed all Catholics in our diocese from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. On June 1st of 2020 our churches were opened, but with restrictions on the amount of people who may gather in our churches along with the requirement of wearing face masks. Our churches are now fully open and some people have returned, doing so in a safe manner. Others are still cautious about returning to Mass. Missing the Eucharist is the main reason people are returning; we are still following strict guidelines for receiving the Bishop Persico has opened up the Eucharist. churches without the distancing and mask wearing, if you have been inoculated against the Covid-19 virus. Recently the Catholic Bishops of Pennsylvania, including Bishop Persico announced that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will be reinstated as of Sunday, August 15. On that date we celebrate The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary; the day on which we remember the occasion of the Virgin Mary's bodily assent into heaven at the end of her life.

There is great concern that without regular inperson attendance, it will be easier for people to just walk away from regularly attending Mass. The longer people stay away the easier it becomes for us to just not come back at all. We are hoping that with the Bishop's announcement of the obligation of returning, we will again have a full congregation. Our coming back will benefit our community spiritually, emotionally, and financially.

It may be helpful if we remember these lyrics of the popular song, *Hosea*.

Come back to me with all your heart. Don't let fear keep us apart.
