

Today, we pause and remember the 25 million people who have had to flee their countries in search of safety for their families. According to the 1951 Refugee Convention, a refugee is one who "owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, is outside the country of his nationality, and is unable to, or owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself to the protection of that country." The Catholic Church has for decades taken seriously the plight of these vulnerable refugees and through advocacy, education efforts, and service provision sought to provide increased protections for them.

# WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

#### NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

We don't know the actual date of the birth of John the Baptist. No biblical or historical record tells us. But Luke's Gospel (1:36) says that John's mother, Elizabeth, was six months pregnant when the angel Gabriel obtained Mary's consent to become the mother of Jesus. A tradition eventually established December 25 for the liturgical observance of the birth of Christ, so the Nativity of John the Baptist was placed on the calendar six months earlier.

In the northern hemisphere this works out especially well because of something John the Baptist said in reference to Christ, according to John 3:30: "He must increase, but I must decrease." The hours of daylight begin to decrease with the birth of John the Baptist, only to increase with the birth of Christ.

Normally, the Catholic liturgical calendar celebrates the anniversary of a saint's death because it marks the birth of that saint into eternal life. There are three exceptions. The calendar observes the nativity of these central New Testament figures: Jesus, Mary, and John the Baptist. John foreshadows Christ by his birth, his preaching, and his martyrdom. So important is his nativity that we observe it every year, even when it falls on a Sunday. We replace the usual readings and prayers of Ordinary Time in order to honor the birth of an extraordinary saint.

The Missal offers two sets of presidential prayers, one for the Vigil Mass on the evening of June 23, and the other for the Mass during the day on June 24. These prayers allude to biblical passages about John as the Precursor of Christ. Among these is the Benedictus, the hymn sung by John's father Zachariah, which forms part of the Church's Morning Prayer every day of the year.
