WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

The Lay Faithful

The faithful who, having been incorporated into Christ through Baptism, are made part of the people of God, the Church. The laity participate in their own way in the priestly, prophetic, and kingly functions of Christ. Laity are distinguished from clergy (who have received Holy Orders) and those in consecrated life. (897)

— Catechism of the Catholic Church

The structure of the Catholic Church can be described in an order of Roles within the Faithful, with each having a special responsibility within the Church. Each role is important and necessary for the Church to function properly. The roles in the Catholic Church are: 1) Pope, 2) Bishops, 3) Priests and Deacons, 4) Consecrated Life, and 5) Lay People.

The **laity** are people who are not ordained or in a consecrated state of life. Some would say that this means the role of the laity is less important. But that is not the case at all. The laity are the people whose primary vocation (mission) is to bring Christ to the everyday world. It is the laity who bring Christ into schools, hospitals, factories, and offices.

Through their Baptism laypeople are called to share the priestly, prophetic, and kingly office of Christ. The laity share in the priesthood of Christ by living a holy life and by raising up their family life, their work, their studies, their relationships with friends, and even their leisure time to God in prayer. Participation in the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist, is also an important way they share in the priesthood of Christ. The laity share in the prophetic office of Christ by proclaiming Christ to others in every situation and every circumstance through their words and deeds. The laity share in the kingly office of Christ by working against immorality in society by changing sinful institutions, speaking out against sinful situations, and by serving others, particularly those who are poor and suffering. The kingly office also calls laypeople to exercise leadership within the Church whenever appropriate.

When are you acting in a kingly way, serving others to ease the suffering and injustice in the world?
