

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

November 18th marks the Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles on our liturgical calendar. The foundation of these two churches goes back several centuries. It goes back to when Peter and Paul shed their blood and were buried where these two basilicas still stand today.

St. Peter was the Prince of the Apostles and Bishop of Rome. He was believed to have been crucified upside down.

St. Paul was an evangelist spreading the Gospel far and wide, nourishing Christian communities. He was also recognized as one of the earliest converts to the faith. Paul was also beheaded on or around the same day that Peter was crucified.

As we honor the dedication of these two basilicas we honor much more than two churches. We honor these two saints as we remember that we are all called to become pillars of the faith to which we build. Let us renew our life to the mission of Christ, that we may imitate the holy lives of these two men of God.


Holy Apostles Peter and Paul intercede for us; protect us as we trust in the patronage of your sainthood. Amen.

US Bishops' International Justice and Peace Committee offers statement on Israel and Palestine: In response to the escalating Israel-Hamas war, Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, Illinois, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on International Justice and Peace, has issued a statement saying, "We must not grow weary of offering our prayers and support for peace and justice for all concerned," and that "a lasting solution respecting the rights, needs, and aspirations of both Israelis and Palestinians remains essential to these ends." As early as the fourth century, the Church has maintained that Catholics behave in **Eucharistic** Eucharistic Lite and maintained that they mean what they profess. It's not unreasonable; many other smaller organizations have codes of conduct. Over the years the number of precepts has slightly varied according to time or region.

Whatever their number, the purpose of the precepts has always been to preserve good order in the Church, to maintain discipline within the Church, and to establish a specific Catholic identity. The Precepts of the Church are as follows: Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation; Confessions of serious sin at least once a year; Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season; Observance of the days of fast and abstinence; Providing for the needs of the Church.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

On the weekend of November 18-19, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).
