WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS EUCHARIST

The second Sacrament of Initiation is Eucharist. The Eucharist is also known as the Lord's Supper, Divine Liturgy, Mass or Communion. The word Mass is Latin for dismiss or sending forth which is part of the dismissing rite as we are sent forth from the Mass. The Eucharist is the partaking of



the Body and Blood of Jesus and is His real presence. It represents an actual meal in that we take the bread, break the bread, distribute the bread, and eat of the bread; this not an ordinary meal but a heavenly banquet. When we receive Communion, we truly encounter Christ, partaking of His body and blood. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church it is stated:

By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity. (CCC 1413)

This means that what you see, feel and touch seems like bread and wine; in reality they are actually the Body and Blood of Christ. The priest consecrates but the action is that of Christ. During the Eucharist we need to express our gratitude for what God has done for us. If we take this seriously, it leads us to become more thankful for all of our blessings in our lives, in our families and friends, etc. So at the end of Mass when we are sent forth to love and serve our God, we should mean it with all our hearts because we have just given thanks for all our blessings. Before we receive Communion we are asked to put aside our individual differences and grudges before we take the Eucharist. When we give the Sign of Peace it gives us a chance to reconcile and make peace with one another. That is because with Christ there is neither Jew nor Greek, male nor female, rich nor poor, and on and on.

When we present ourselves to receive the Eucharist, we are still seeing many come forth and bow to the person in front of them. The instructions say you are to make a slight bow of your head at the host being held up for you whether you take it on the tongue or in the hand. If you receive it in the hand make sure both of your hands are free to make a cup to hold the host and then immediately pick it up with your other hand and consume it before returning to your seat.
