#### PARISH RETREAT

WHAT IS A RETREAT? It is a period of time in which a person goes away from their daily routine to pray, think about and reflect on their life with God.

Each year our Pastoral Advisory Council from St. Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes has suggested that we offer a day of retreat for all members of the parish. In past years this retreat has been attended by people ranging in age from 6 months to 95 years old and enjoyed by all. We have used many resources to lead us on our day of retreat. Last year we used students from Franciscan University Steubenville's SENT Ministries. Many people who attended asked if we could get this group back for another retreat. They will offer sessions for Adults, Confirmation Journey students, Junior High students and Elementary age level students. We will provide a baby sitter for the little ones younger than Kindergarten age. This year our retreat will be held at Our Lady of Lourdes beginning with 10:30 am Mass, (note the change in Mass schedule as the 8:30 am Mass will be at St. Hippolyte) on Sunday, March 29. A catered lunch will follow after Mass, with donations being accepted, but please don't let that deter you from attending.

This retreat is a required retreat for all of our parish's Confirmation Journey Students (grades 9-11). We will also be including guest Confirmation students from other local parishes, so let us all welcome them, too. Our diocese also requires retreats for all grade levels of Faith Formation students. [We will also be having a retreat for our First Reconciliation students on Saturday, March 21st and for our First Eucharist students on Saturday, April 18th.]

We hope that this retreat will lead us to seek and love as Jesus loves and that we can live and act and commit ourselves to His grace. Loving others is a spiritual force which draws us into union with God and most especially with each other.

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I write to you in the midst of a heightened awareness of the dangers not only of the flu but also the coronavirus. As your shepherd, I want to be present to you in your concerns. The situation calls for responsible measures on our part, both to put people at ease in their worship and to help to prevent the spread of these diseases.

For this reason, I have issued the following directives for all Masses in the Diocese of Erie, which are effective immediately until further notice:

- The exchange of the sign of peace among the faithful is to be omitted.
- At Communion time, the distribution of the Body of Christ will continue as usual. I am
  encouraging you to receive the sacred host in your hand, but please know that your right
  to receive on the tongue remains in place and is to be respected.
- I am suspending the distribution of the Precious Blood to everyone other than the priest and deacon.

A few reminders may also be helpful. Please remember that if you are not feeling well, you are dispensed from the obligation to participate in Mass and should stay home until you are well. Also, you should not feel obligated to shake anyone's hand on the way in or out of church, nor should you feel obligated to use the holy water fonts if you prefer not to. Your pastor himself may decide to refrain from shaking hands. We will respect the choices that you make to protect your health.

During these times, we need to rely not only on common sense but also on prayer – prayer for the sick, prayer for researchers, prayer for health workers. Be assured of my own prayers for you as well. May the Lord bless you, and keep you and your loved ones safe.

## Liturgical directives from Bishop Persico in light of flu season and the coronavirus, as of March 3, 2020

From the Bishop:

"The current flu season, coupled with the advance of coronavirus cases here in the United States, calls us to take responsible measures to put our people at ease in their worship and to work to prevent the spread of these diseases in our parishes, schools, and other institutions.

As a result, I am implementing the following liturgical directives for all Masses in the Diocese of Erie, effective immediately until further notice:

#### SIGN OF PEACE

The exchange of the sign of peace among the faithful is to be omitted.

- The exchange of peace in the liturgy takes place verbally between the celebrant and the faithful, which remains in place.
- When appropriate, the deacon or priest may ordinarily opt to invite the people to exchange peace among themselves. It is this optional exchange among the faithful which is to be omitted. It is not to be adapted or altered it is to be omitted.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The distribution of the Body of Christ in the sacred host will continue as usual.

I encourage the faithful at this time to receive in the hand, but the right of each individual to
receive on the tongue, as guaranteed by the universal law of the Church, remains in place
and is to be respected.

The distribution of the Precious Blood to the faithful is to be suspended.

- We are mindful of the teaching of the Church that those who receive only the host nonetheless receive the whole Body, Blood, soul, and divinity of Christ.
- Out of concern for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who would otherwise need
  to consume what remains of the Precious Blood at the end of Communion, and to prevent
  any practices contrary to the proper reverence for the Holy Eucharist, only the priest (and
  deacon if present) will receive the Precious Blood.
- Under no circumstances is the Precious Blood to be poured into the sacrarium.

#### GREETING BEFORE OR AFTER MASS

Celebrants who greet people must respect the right of individuals not to shake hands.

- No one should take offense at someone who does not want to shake hands.
- Likewise, no one should feel obligated to use holy water upon entering or leaving the church.

As the situation here in the Diocese of Erie changes, these liturgical directives may need to be amended. In the meantime, we pray for all the sick, and in particular for those suffering from the flu or from the coronavirus. We pray for the researchers trying to find a treatment, and we pray for those who are caring for the sick throughout the world."
