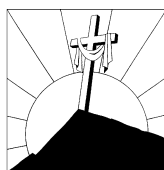

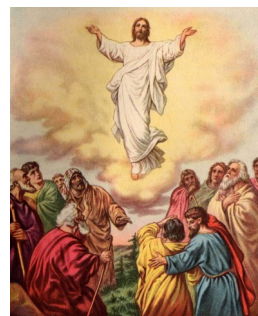

DIOCESE ANNOUNCES PLAN FOR GRADUAL RETURN TO PUBLIC WORSHIP DURING THE PANDEMIC.

As all 13 counties of the Diocese of Erie move into the yellow phase for reopening, Bishop Lawrence Persico has announced the diocese will take a gradual approach to restoring public worship in northwest Pennsylvania. General protocols, including the suspension of public Masses, remain in effect, but permission has been restored for pastors to schedule periods of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as well as times for confessions. Bishop Persico will host a virtual town hall on the topic through Zoom on Thursday, May 21, at 7:00p.m. Parishioners are invited to sign up for the event through a link on the diocesan homepage www.eriercd.org where you will be able to submit questions for the bishop by email. In addition, the event will be posted on the diocesan website the day afterwards for viewing by those who cannot participate on May 21st.

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

A few years ago the Catholic Sisters of the Diocese of Erie passed out **BE KIND** magnets for us to place on our vehicles. In Galatians 5:23 we are given the Fruits of the Spirit and one of the Fruits is **Kindness**. Goodness and **Kindness** are like a light that shines through and is seen and affects other people. Let us all make our light shine and make the world a better place by the **Kindness** we bring to others. How have you experienced that light of goodness and **Kindness**?
