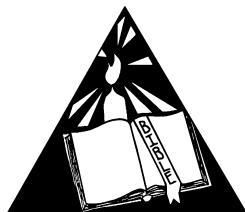

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS



Last Sunday we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord. To have an epiphany means we are having an "aha!" moment. The Epiphany is a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of

Jesus Christ and commemorates the visit from the Magi to the Christ Child. Epiphany comes from the Greek word for appearance of the divine nature of Jesus. The word epiphany also means a sudden flash of understanding or insight. The Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated 12 days after Christmas on January 6, but in the Catholic tradition we celebrate Epiphany on the second Sunday following Christmas.

We hope you had the opportunity to bless your home and inscribe 20 + C + M + B 21 above your door. The CMB stand for the magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) and *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* which translates as *May Christ Bless this House*. This inscription is a reminder that we should be with and go with Christ in all of our comings and goings.

Today marks the end of the Christmas Season with our celebration of The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. After being baptized in the river Jordan by John the Baptist, the heavens were



opened and the Holy Spirit, like a dove, descended and lit on Jesus. Then a voice from Heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Mark 1:11)

The Baptism of Jesus is described in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. Baptism for us is to forgive us from original sin and a sign of repentance. When we bring our children for baptism, we are gifting them with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which will later be deepened in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Every family in the parish received a 3 month subscription to *Magnificat* for Christmas. In the January issue on page 141 is the reading of Mark 1:7-11 about Jesus' baptism and on page 142-143 you will find a Meditation of the Day. Both of these are excellent resources for you to learn more about the Baptism of Jesus.

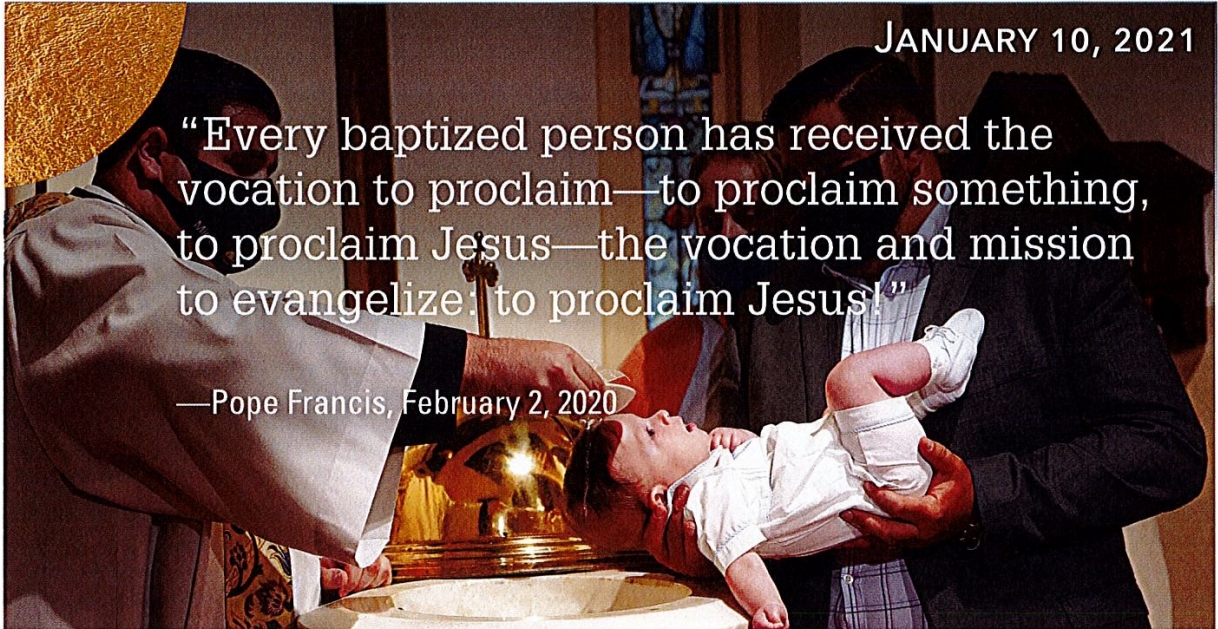

The Baptism of the Lord

Today, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord!

The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. “He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake . . . to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water” (St. Gregory Nazianzen, Liturgy of the Hours, I, 634).

Jesus’ immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God’s will. Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin—Original and actual—and begin to live a new life with God.
