Our Lady of Lourdes Church is open for private prayer each Friday until noon, following the Communion Service and Rosary.



WHOLE COMMUNITY **CATECHESIS**

Holy Family

On the Sunday after Christmas, the Catholic community gathers at church to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. If Christmas falls on a Sunday, the feast is transferred to Friday, December 30, because the following Sunday is January, 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Prior to Second Vatican Council, the feast of the Holy Family fell on Sunday during the week after January The revised calendar has moved the observance closer to the commemoration of the birth of Christ and therefore to the "birth" of his family.

The Scripture readings may change from year to year, but the Gospels tell episodes from the early days of Jesus' family life: the flight into Egypt to escape the forces of Herod, the Presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple, and the find of the twelve-year -old Jesus in the Temple. All these events are human and hopeful. The other readings provide stories, psalms, and reflections on the beauty of family life.

For families reunited to celebrate Christmas, this feast provides a fitting opportunity to gather again in God's house.

The Book of Blessings and the Catholic Household Book of Blessings and *Prayers* both contain blessings for families. These can be offered by a priest or a deacon, or by any layperson at home. This feast would be an appropriate day for any family to seek the blessings that come from God, who became like us by living with human parents.

The Collect for the mass prays that we may imitate the Holy Family by practicing the virtues of family life and by bonds of charity. In this way, we who share a house on earth may enter the household of God in heaven.

I recently read an article comparing a young man entering military service with entering the priesthood. Both are soldiers, one for physical battle and the other spiritual battle, and both require strength, grit and determination. One big difference is the honors and glory military soldiers receive - people say "thank you for your service." The priest faces indifference and at times open hostility - and how often do we thank them for their service? We need to give

them more help, whether by encouraging more vocations, our prayer, material/financial support, etc. A soldier can't win a battle without resources, why should we expect our priests to? What concrete commitment can we each make to helping our priests this year?

Dear Parishioners of St. Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish:

There are two important news items in our partnered parish arrangement.

First, on June 2, 1988, the Congregation for Divine Worship in Rome *Directory for Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest.* The chapter titled "Conditions for Holding Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest" begins in this way: "Whenever and wherever Mass cannot be celebrated on <u>Sunday</u>, the first thing to be ascertained is whether the faithful can go to a church in a place nearby to participate there in the <u>eucharistic mystery.</u> At the present time this solution is to be recommended and to be retained where it is in effect." The *Directory* doesn't even consider weekdays.

This is because, "Sacramental communion received during Mass is the more perfect participation in the eucharistic celebration. The eucharistic sign is expressed more dearly when the faithful receive the body of the Lord from the same sacrifice after the communion of the priest." (Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship, *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass*, June 21, 1973) A service consisting of a liturgy of the word and distribution of Holy Communion does not include the re-presentation of the one sacrifice of the Cross as is the case at Mass, the very source of the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

For this reason, Bishop Persico has directed that Communion services at St. Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes Parishes be discontinued by January 2024. The plan was to relate this to Parish Council at the meeting in November and then to the parishes, but the meeting was cancelled due to the inability of council members to attend because of the snowstorm that day.

So, stretching the time frame a bit, Monday January 15, 2024 will be the date for the final Communion Service at St. Hippolyte, and Friday, January 19, 2024 the final Communion Service at Our Lady of Lourdes. I regret that this announcement leaves less time to adjust than I had hoped.

This directive from the Bishop only applies to Communion Services. Other services made up of the liturgy of the word and prayer, or the Rosary, or the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, or Eucharistic Adoration, etc. are not affected.

I realize that we all have had many changes of late affecting our lives of faith. These can be painful and difficult. But we do have access to Mass and the sacraments at St. Hippolyte's and several other nearby parishes depending on where we live, and we have other activities that are also a significant part of parish life in our home parish.

Secondly, it is particular law of the Diocese of Erie that partnered parishes have a joint Parish Council. Having met and discussed this with Councils of both St. Hippolyte and The Epiphany of the Lord parishes we concluded that the best way to start down this road would be to have a joint meeting of the councils twice this year, one in January and one in May. In the meetings we want to emphasize members getting to know each other, councils getting to know what is going on at each parish, and together finding ways to volunteer at and promote each other's events. From this foundation we look to chart a course forward.
