FEBRUARY 26 IS ASH WEDNESDAY. Masses will be celebrated at 5:00pm at Our Lady of Lourdes and 7:00pm at Saint Hippolyte. Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of **fasting** for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

#### WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26, prepares us to celebrate the Holy Triduum (which begins on Holy Thursday and continues with Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday) as well as the entire Season of Easter.

On Ash Wednesday we receive ashes in the shape of a cross on our forehead to show our faith and do penance. As we observe these 40 days, we copy Jesus Christ's sacrifice and His journey into the desert (Matthew 4:2, Mark 1:13, and Luke 4:2). It is a time for us to fast, to pray,



and to do works of mercy for those in need or who are sick. Keeping need or who are sick. A Holy Lent There are many ways follow these

works. Here are just a few suggestions for you to make your own journey through Lent.

- 1. Choose your Lenten sacrifice: doing a good work, fasting from something that you like, such as smoking, candy, alcohol, criticizing others, swearing. There are just too many things to mention here, but you know what you need to abstain from.
- 2. Do something positive: spend more time with your family, pray more, visit the shut-ins, stop holding grudges and forgive.
- 3. Attend Mass more frequently, pray more often, attend the Stations of the Cross, participate in the soup and bread meals with your parish family, come to the Seder Meal. Attend the Parish Family Retreat on March 29<sup>th</sup> at Our Lady of Lourdes, beginning with the 10:30am Mass until 3:00 pm.
- 4. Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- 5. Fast from meat on Fridays if you are over the age of 14. East only one meal a day on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent. Some families follow the fasting regulations during Lent, no matter their ages.
- 6. Participate in Operation Rice Bowl and other acts of charity.
- 7. Pray the Rosary every day with your family.
- 8. Join one of the Lenten discussion groups "Lenten Longings, let yourself be ...." Even if you haven't signed up, just come and we will welcome you. You can join a group even

if you are unable to attend every session.
