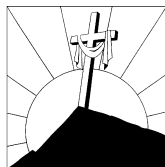

CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS—Child Abuse Prevention Month: Be Vigilant

It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children. And we must always communicate our concerns to the appropriate parties. Sometimes this means communicating our safety concerns to our children. And sometimes this means communicating our concerns about seemingly inappropriate behavior to those who are in a position to intervene. Parents must also listen carefully to their children and observe both their children's activities and the behavior of other children and adults who interact with them. When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes. Being aware of what's happening with our children means talking to, listening to, and observing them—at every opportunity.

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

On April 30, 2000 Pope John II declared the Sunday after Easter as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. This year it will be celebrated on April 19th. The origin of Divine Mercy was recorded in Sr. Faustina's diary that grants Grace from the devotion of Divine Mercy. Whoever receives communion on Divine Mercy Sunday and goes to confession may obtain forgiveness of all their sins and it means that a person could go to heaven without going to purgatory.



After receiving the Divine Mercy image Saint Faustina wrote this message from Jesus in her diary:

"I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul will know about it."

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy"

Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the mercy and love that Christ gave us in his death, burial and resurrection. Pope John II told us that "Divine Mercy reaches us through the heart of Christ crucified."

Sadly, this year we are unable to receive the Eucharist but we may call the priest for an appointment to make a private confession and we can pray The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy. There are pamphlets and cards in our churches on how to pray the Chaplet or you can visit the website
