## WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

### THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Corpus Christi Sunday, which is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday, commemorates the institution of the Eucharist. It is also called the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Today is a Catholic Christian liturgical solemnity that celebrates the transubstantiation of bread and wine into the Real Presence of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.



Bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. Belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is central to our Catholic faith. We find this in Matthew 26:26-28, "Take and eat; this is my body. Then he took a cup and gave thanks and said, "Take and drink for this is my blood."

Some people have trouble believing that the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Christ, but this is the teaching of our Catholic faith that stresses the importance of believing this about the Eucharist. When we approach the priest or the minister of the Eucharist we should look at the bread or the cup and after they say the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ we then respond AMEN with faith, joy and hope. Imagine that you are saying THANK YOU which is what the Amen means. Then take the communion with all those present around you.

At the present time we are encouraged to receive the Eucharist in the hand rather than on the tongue. Either way, we approach the minister with open hearts and hands. Many times we rush this intimate moment and do not make ourselves present to our Lord and respond in Faith as a true believer. AMEN
