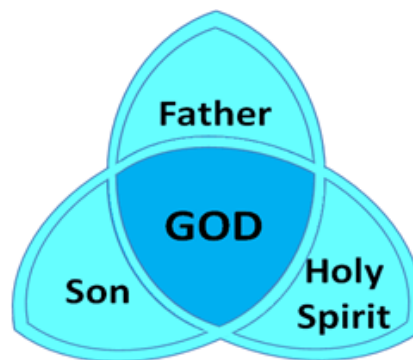
WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Next Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday. Celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost, this Solemnity celebrates the Holy Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The three are distinct, yet are one substance. Trinity Sunday is a Christian feast dedicated to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, the essence of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. We give thanks for all the Trinity has done to save us from our sins. The Gospel of Matthew 28:19 the only one of the four Gospels in which Jesus gives instructions to the disciples to go out and baptize "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The Trinity celebrates the three persons of God, the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. This is one of the most difficult concepts of Christianity to understand. It is important for Christians because it is central to our worship and what we believe - that is of a God who is incomprehensible.

Trinity Sunday has been celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost from as early as the 10th century. Some people have used a three-leaf clover or a triangle to explain the Trinity to children. Like the three persons of the Trinity, may WE become united in PEACE and LOVE through the Holy Spirit.

When we make the Sign of the Cross we profess the deepest mystery of our Christian faith, of the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Sign of the Cross is a prayer and a statement of our belief.



Today we are thankful that Bishop Persico has given us permission to gather in our churches with all pews being utilized and that we do not need to wear masks. The bishop still recommends that you wear a mask if you have not been vaccinated, both for your protection and that of others. Please do not ask people if they have been vaccinated and likewise, do not tell others that they should remove their masks or wear a mask.

Pentecost

Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The following prayer was recited by Pope Benedict XVI in a homily on November 7, 2006. This is a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Let us invoke him
so that he will irrigate, warm and straighten,
so that he will pervade us
with the power of his sacred flame
and renew the earth.
Let us pray for his with all our hearts
at this time, in these days.
Amen.
