COMMUNITY AND GROWTH by Jean Vanier

Jean Vanier, founder of L'Arche communities for adults with disabilities, recently died in May. Below are a few of his quotes which explain Community and Growth.

"A community is only being created when its members accept that they are not going to achieve great things, that they are not going to be heroes, but simply live each day with new hope, like children, in wonderment as the sun rises and in thanksgiving as it sets. Community is only being created when they have recognized that the greatness of man is to accept his insignificance, his human condition and his earth, and to thank God for having put in a finite body the seeds of eternity which are visible in small and daily gestures of love and forgiveness. The beauty of man is in this fidelity to the wonder of each day."

"As a growing community must integrate three elements: a life of silent prayer, a life of service and above all of listening to the poor, and community life through which all its members can grow in their own gift."

"A community that is growing rich and seeks only to defend its goods and its reputation is dying, it has ceased to grow in love. A community is alive when it is poor and its members feel they have to work together and remain united, if only to ensure that they can all eat tomorrow."

---Community and Growth

"Each person with his or her history of being accepted or rejected, with his or her past history of inner pain and difficulties in relationships with parents, is different. But in each one there is yearning for communion and belonging, but at the same time a fear of it. Love is what we want, yet it is what we fear the most. Love makes us vulnerable and open, but then we can be hurt through rejection and separation. We may crave for love, but them be frightened of losing our liberty and creativity. We want to belong to a group but we fear a certain death in the group because we may not be seen as unique. We want love, but fear the dependence and commitment it implies; we fear being used, manipulated, smothered and spoiled. We are all so ambivalent toward love, community and belonging."
