Mass of the Lord's Supper will follow the meal at 7:30pm at Saint Hippolyte Church.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month-Reporting known or suspected child abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2021 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 5,036 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania. 2,171 or 39.9% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,418 were physical abuse. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. *To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). In the Diocese of Erie for particular questions on reporting abuse, you may call The Office for the Protection of Children and Youth at 814-824-1195.*

Easter Triduum



Welcome to Holy Week! All are welcome and encouraged to attend the Chrism Mass at St. Peter Cathedral on Monday at 1:00pm. The blessing of the holy oils that we use for our sacraments throughout the year takes place at this Mass. Many of our diocesan priests will be in attendance and it is a beautiful Mass.

On Thursday we begin the summit of the Liturgical Year with the celebration of *The Sacred Paschal Triduum* (TRID-oo-um) during which we celebrate the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus into new life. In our parish we begin together with our evening meal on Holy Thursday at 6:15pm at Saint Hippolyte. The Mass of the Lord's Supper follows the meal at 7:30pm. On Holy Thursday, Christ commands us to love one another and we symbolize this by the Washing of Feet. A time of Eucharistic adoration follows this Mass. Return your rice bowl at this Mass.

Please join us at 3:00pm on Good Friday at Saint Hippolyte as we celebrate the Passion of the Lord. On Good Friday we have a solemn Veneration of the Cross. We commemorate this day by departing in silence as we continue our paschal fast and wait for Holy Saturday.

The Great Vigil of Easter is celebrated on Holy Saturday at 8:30pm at Saint Hippolyte. We begin with the lighting of the fire and the blessing of the Paschal (Easter) Candle. We then recount the story of our salvation history with readings from scripture. The Alleluia again returns before the proclamation of the Gospel. After the homily we will welcome into full communion our two candidates: Laurie Hamilton and Scott Wheelock.

Following the Easter Vigil we move to the social hall for our annual Break—Fast celebration. All are encouraged to bring Easter foods and goodies to share with our parish family and friends.

On Sunday morning we continue our celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord during our regularly scheduled Masses: 8:00am at Our Lady of Lourdes and 11:00am at Saint Hippolyte. The Paschal Triduum officially ends with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.

Let us use this week to add a sacrifice and create a space for silence for our Lord to grow more deeply in our lives. And let us not forget that next Sunday the Easter Season is just beginning, and does not end until Pentecost.

Have a blessed Holy Week, Triduum, and Easter Season.
